Fr. Daniel G. Groody, CSC, PhD, STL, currently serves as Assistant Professor of Theology and the Director of the Center for Latino Spirituality and Culture at the Institute for Latino Studies at the University of Notre Dame. A Catholic priest and member of the Congregation of the Holy Cross, he has worked many years in Latin America, particularly along the US-Mexican Border. He spent the 2007-08 academic year as a visiting research fellow at Oxford University's Refugee Centre and was one of seven academic experts selected to participate in the Vatican's Sixth World Congress on Pastoral Care of Migrants and Refugees held November 2009 in Rome.

In addition to teaching, writing and lecturing on US Latino spirituality, globalization and the relationship of Christian spirituality to social justice, he has also written and edited several books and produced award-winning documentary films, including "One Border, One Body: Immigration and the Eucharist," and "Dying to Live: A Migrant's Journey." Fr. Groody lectures widely in the United States, Latin America and Europe.

He holds a B.A. from the University of Notre Dame, a Master of Divinity and a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley, and a Ph.D. from the Graduate Theological Union.

Immigration is a complex issue that is changing the face of cultures worldwide. In the United States, it is often a controversial issue with many social, economic, political and even religious implications. In the midst of the debate, what often gets lost are the human issues at stake.

Fr. Daniel Groody, CSC, will address the geographical territory, the conceptual territory and the theological territory in light of the journey of the migrant and the challenge of the gospels. He will help us explore who our migrants are, why they leave their homes and what they face in their journey. We will reflect on the human struggle for a more dignified life and the search to find God in the midst of that struggle.
