PRAISE TEAM LEADER

Pat, our Music Director of Traditional and Children's music, has done a marvelous job of developing the music department. Over 30 years, she has grown the program to include the Chancel choir, the Men's chorus, the Bell choir, chimes, youth choir, and children's choirs. The Program has grown to include an additional staff person and many volunteers to which we now invest over \$30,000 a year to support these wonderful and varied ministries. And now we are looking to grow it more.

Last year, the Administrative Council and Staff parish were approached by the Early Service music team asking for additional support. They felt it was time to start financially investing in a music leader for this service. It was time to hire someone whose job it was to be present every Sunday, to coordinate the Praise Team, to help the Pastor plan songs, and to prepare the Media Shout Program. Various people, including Pat, were in on the drawing up of the job description. Pat stated that she did not want this position. So Council decided to support the Praise Team's request, to post the agreed upon job description, and to offer a stipend of \$3600 a year (300 a month).

Pat has done such a great job developing the music department and we are sure that now is the time to take the next step in investing in this side of our music program as well. The job description has been posted on various sites (and a copy is at the end of the newsletter) and we are hoping for applicants. If you know of someone who might be interested or called to serve, please share with them our position and encourage them to send contact us.

TIMES ARE CHANGING – CONSERVATION

The first house my family owned was a three story apartment building with a full basement. We lived on the second and third floors. Our concept of conservation was much different than it is today. Oh electricity was expensive but we didn't care because we used a coal furnace in the basement that also heated the hot water. Since we lived less than a block from the railroad yard where they delivered the coal, we would walk down with a wheelbarrow and offer to clean the entrance in exchange for a load of coal. The only problem was that because we were picking it off the road and it was dirty and not uniform size. If you were not careful the coal would get low in the furnace and the embers would stop glowing. Most of the time we did not worry. We had an automatic feed system. It was me and my brother plus a shovel. Because I was the oldest, it was my fault if the furnace went out in the middle of the night and you can imagine what my family suggested when I allowed that to happen. I had to take the last bath. With six baths in front of me, I enjoyed (ha-ha) a cold bath. Conservation meant, keep the fire going and the windows and doors closed.

So utility control was not a matter of cost as much as it was maintenance of the coal chute and seals on the windows.

Well times have changed. Coal is still cheap but most of us don't buy coal except indirectly through the power company. Trinity's electric bill is up 40% this year. It would be no problem if everyone paid 62 cents every time they walked into church. 62 cents plus their normal giving that is.

A better plan might be to reduce our usage where it is convenient. We have been replacing bulbs that burn out with higher efficiency bulbs. Doors usually don't stand open. The door seals were replaced not too long ago. A fairly good sized item would be to turn the lights on when we need them and keep those off that we do not need. The second item is to reduce the thermostats when the space is not in use.

Soon there will be little reminders at the doors about turning out the lights. In the education wing the rooms have a switch that says occupied and unoccupied. Please turn it to unoccupied when you leave.

We can collect the coins at the door, but we also can be more attentive to some simple measures.

UMCOR KITS FOR ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Every year the Trinity United Methodist Women (UMW) participate in the "Kits for Conference" drive for Annual Conference. The kits are basic items gathered for the United Methodist Committee on Relief (UMCOR) for worldwide distribution. There are five types of kits: birthing kit, school kit, baby/layette kit, sewing kit and health kit. Trinity UMW will be putting together two types of kits for collection at Annual Conference in June.



The items needed for the Sewing Kit are three continuous yards of fabric, (cotton or cotton blend only, no heavy duty, corduroy, knit, etc., please no patriotic, religious, holiday, camouflage, or military patterned fabric), 1 pair of scissors (fabric scissors only), 1 package of needles (hand needles in original packaging only), 1 spool of thread (medium to large spool, no travel kit thread please), 5-8 buttons (5/8 inch size or larger, no loose buttons/tie together or leave in the package), 1 plastic bag (one gallon size sealable bags only). All items must be new. *Do not wash the fabric as then it will be considered used.*

The items needed for the Baby/Layette Kit are: 6 cloth diapers, 2 shirts or one-piece body suits (size 3-6months), 2 baby washcloths, 2 gowns or sleepers (size 3-6 months), 2 diaper pins, 1 sweater open in front (size 3-6 months), 2 receiving blankets.

The UMW would like to invite everyone to participate in this year's kits for conference drive. Items will be due on Sunday, May 11, 2014 ("MOTHER'S DAY"). You may want to collect a few of the listed items or complete an entire kit. All items must be new. Any monetary donations will be used to complete the kits or to pay for processing and shipping. The average cost of a sewing kit is \$18. and the layette kit, \$35. Because of the strict rules in other countries, please do not add items not listed or put more than the listed quantity. Personal notes or cards are also not allowed. Please place items in designated boxes in the hall. The UMW will inventory donations and add any items needed to complete the kits. **JOB DESCRIPTION
PRAISE TEAM LEADER
TRINITY UNITED METHODIST CHURCH**

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The purpose of the Praise Team Leader is to provide spiritual and musical leadership for the Contemporary Worship Service and as needed for other services. The Praise Team Leader shall lead and direct the TUMC Praise Team, recruit members for the group as necessary, and perform or coordinate with Praise Team members or TUMC staff to ensure timely completion of associated administrative duties.

DUTIES

The Praise Team Leader shall:

- Collaborate with the Pastor on the selection of the music, as necessary, and assist with other services as directed by the Organist/Music Director.
- Prepare music and schedule and supervise rehearsals of the Praise Team at least weekly, and lead congregational singing during the Contemporary Worship Service.
- Prepare and introduce new selections for the Praise Team.
- Submit weekly contemporary music selections for the bulletin.
- Select soloist and ensemble singers for musical selections.
- Recruit, organize, and support volunteers for the Praise Team.
- Ensure that presentation media is updated weekly for the Contemporary Service.
- Ensure that musical services/arrangements are provided in the event of her/his absence from a worship service or other musical event.
- Develop an annual budget for the Praise Team and adhere to approved budget.
- Maintain and update CCLI records, and maintain the Contemporary Music Library.
- Attend the Worship Work Area committee meetings, or appoint a designee if unable to attend, and participate in the annual planning workshop in January to ensure integration of the Praise Team in the planning and activities of TUMC for the upcoming year.
- Perform, oversee, or participate in, as appropriate, any ancillary functions or activities of TUMC that potentially or actually impact the Praise Team.
- Coordinate with Praise Team members to participate in activities or events external to TUMC.
- Participate in Continuing Education for worship styles and practices.
- Maintain Praise Team equipment and purchase any approved additional equipment, such as, microphone, music stands, monitors that may be needed for the Contemporary Worship Service and related programs.

REPORTING RELATIONSHIP

The Pastor is the supervisor of the Praise Team Leader. The Lay Leader and a member of the Staff Parish Relations Committee in consultation with the Pastor shall evaluate the Praise Team Leader's performance.

KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS AND ABILITIES

Excellent musical sight-reading skills and the ability to balance and integrate instrumental and vocal components of musical selections. Should be strong in vocal mixing of harmonies and able to coach musicians for blending of instrumentals and vocals for balance.

Proficient on guitar and/or keyboard and in voice.

Must be able to develop and demonstrate effective leadership abilities and working relationships.

Must be able to choose music that fits the capabilities of the musicians.

Must be knowledgeable of contemporary worship music and artists.

Must be able to work in a team environment and be a team player.

Must be able to work with persons of varying musical backgrounds and levels of experience.

Must demonstrate excellent planning and communication skills.

Must be competent using technology in worship including worship software (i.e., Media Shout, sound, and video projection).

EDUCATION/EXPERIENCE

Previous work experience and/or education in a Christian music ministry are required.

EMPLOYMENT SCHEDULE

The position of Praise Team Leader shall be part-time with an estimated 8 to 12 hours per week. The Praise Team Leader's presence is required for Sunday worship services and as specified by the Pastor. Time off will be according to the church Personnel Policy.
