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PASTOR'S CORNER THE NEXT STEP

One of the standard questions that free will Christians ask is 'What is the next step?'

If we are going 'on to perfection in love', how do we "mature to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ"? (Ephesians 4)

We take the next step.... Each of us is on a journey to grow in the love of God and the love of neighbor. This summer my sermons are going to be exploring spiritual growth. Paul describes the growth process as running a race. To be able to run the race to completion, we need to develop our muscles.

This summer we will explore how to develop different muscles needed to keep running the race. Some of the disciplines we will be exploring are the discipline of empowerment/encouragement, intercessory prayer, breath prayers, how to pray without ceasing, the Lord's Prayer as a teaching prayer, speaking the truth in love, tithing, and fasting. As well, every other Wednesday those who want to work on more specific "how-to's" of these disciplines will gather to 'work out our salvation' (John Wesley would say it this way!) We will gather to try our hand at some of the disciplines. One week we will work on sending cards as intercessory prayer; we will play with how to sing our way into spiritual maturity; various types of journaling will also be explored.

What is the next step? We all want to grow in the love of God. This summer I hope to give us some hands on exploration.

GARDEN TO FOOD BANK HUNGER SOLUTION GROWING IN OUR OWN BACKYARD



"Every summer and fall, we see the faces of so many caring people bringing fresh vegetables to share. Last year, we received over 85,000lbs from community and school gardens, small farms, and even businesses that planted a row,"

said Annie Andrews, Feedmore food sourcing manger.

"Every little bit helps, and the pounds really add up, reminds Annie Andrews. "Whether it's a bag of tomatoes from a backyard garden to bushels of corn donated from a local farm, fresh local produce is a real treat for families who have so little."

MAGIC CARPET RIDE: IT'S BEEN A JOURNEY

It's been a journey, this carpet. It started last fall when Bill Foster submitted a request to replace the carpet as part of the Building and Grounds Committee.

At the October 17th, 2013 Council Meeting Bill brought the issue up again. "Bill Foster said that the carpeting in the Sanctuary needs to be replaced. He received bids and the best option is a high traffic carpet that is easy to clean, very durable, and high quality. Estimated cost \$28,000. Much discussion ensued. John Morris said this would be a special project separate from any budgeted item, and will have to have fund raising and church-wide involvement. The Finance Committee will make suggestions regarding the funding. Tom Kennedy moved to make the re-carpet project a non-funded goal for 2014. The motion was seconded and passed. The Worship Committee will select the color."

And so it began. Then Bill and Joan needed to go to California for family support. In the meantime the new chair of Stewardship picked up the call.

At the Council meeting on February 4th, we receive a new update. "Carpeting Project: Ed Barnes reported the cost for replacing the Sanctuary carpet is \$28,000. No date is set. John Morris stated the Finance Committee would like to see about 50% raised before plans set. Ed will obtain copies of estimates. There was much discussion regarding finances and fund raising. David Bailey moved to have the Finance and Stewardship meet to discuss funding ideas and report back to next council meeting. The motion seconded and passed.

In the meantime, Stewardship started to raise money toward the carpet. With a window half of the \$28,000 needed, a newsletter article was submitted and money started coming in.

March 18th, 2014: "Carpet Replacement: Stewardship Chair Ed Barnes reported he and Rev. Keezel met with three additional contractors to see if we could get more competitive bids for the same quality and durability of carpet as was included in the original bid \$28,000. The color has been selected by the Worship Committee. The carpet is 30 ounce which will last many years and will have a very durable backing(current sanctuary carpet is fraying and rippling due to disintegrating backing). Bids are pending. Ed expects a lot lower overall price once the bids are received. Much discussion ensued. If you have questions, write them down and direct them to Ed Barnes. "

At the April Methodist Men's meeting, the question was raised of why not replace all the spaces in the Sanctuary (the section in front of Pat's office, the 'old' office where the copier is, Pat's office) and the back hall.....Bill Foster had requested at the October 17th meeting for permission and funding to replace the hall and the 'old' office with tile. At that time he was granted permission and allocated up to \$1,000 to tile that area. But with Bill out of town, the work got put on hold. Some cabinets have been moved but the other has been waiting until.... The UMM meeting.

So with that back on the question, Ed Barnes went out again and got a bid for the cost of replacing the back hall, and all the spaces on the right and left side of the platform with tile.

When Trustees met in May, they decided to support the request the re-carpet the Sanctuary, to re-carpet Pat's office and to tile the areas in front of the backdoors...but not to retile the back hall.

With Trustees support and with Finance's suggestions of where to take the 50% matching funds from, the request came to Council in May to complete the work. Council voted to support the Finance Committee's plan. The final bids came to be \$23,683 to re-carpet the Sanctuary and \$2,614 to complete the other sections. The total work will cost \$26,297. For the project to be completed, the Congregation needs to donate \$13,148.50

With what the UMM had pledged, we had raised nearly \$9,000 with \$4,200 to put us over the top. After last Sunday, the remaining \$4,200 has been either received or pledged. We are now ready to forward the contract to the Trustees and have it signed. The work can then begin.

We would like to thank you for your commitment to maintaining God's house. We will let you know when the work is scheduled to begin.

SAFE HAVENS



OH Box Program at TUMC

WHAT IS THE PURPOSE?

The purpose of the OneHarvest (OH) food box is to stretch the food dollars of individuals and families across the nation while giving local churches and non-profits the opportunity to love and serve their community.

WHO QUALIFIES?

If you eat, you qualify. There are no applications or qualifications to order OneHarvest food boxes. OneHarvest is open to anyone who wants to order regardless of income level. It also provides an opportunity to those who want to be generous and multiply their giving by passing one on as a blessing.

HOW DOES IT WORK?

OneHarvest boxes are ordered through local churches and non-profits with a monthly deadline and a single delivery date each month. Local OH Partners collect orders and submit them prior to each month's deadline, with orders arriving about 1 week later. Order as many boxes as you like!

WHAT IS IN THE BOX?

There are several boxes to choose from, each being pre-packed and frozen. The current cost per box ranges from \$20 to \$46. Check the webpage for this month's selections.

WHERE DO I PAY FOR AND PICK UP MY FOOD?

OH Boxes can only be ordered with money orders or exact cash here at the church or online at www.oneharvest.com. A receipt will be provided to you and should be presented at pick up.

HOW CAN I HELP?

Look for opportunities to help pick up and pass out food on Distribution Day. ~8 people per month will be needed to make this ministry a success. There is something to do for everyone. Please be on the lookout for important dates, times and deadlines. Administrative Council Meeting
May 13, 2014

Invocation: The invocation was provided by Reverend Keezel.

Minutes: The minutes from the 3/18/14 Council meeting were approved as submitted.

Old Business:

A. Sanctuary Carpet and Tiling Project: Ed Barnes as Stewardship Chair, presented the history and overview of the re-carpeting project. Joining his presentation were Carroll Roach and Kent Hope of Sterling Unlimited. The original bid was revised to include extending the project to the back hall thresholds on either side of the choir loft area and is currently at \$23,683. Quality, durability, installation, warranty, etc., were discussed at length with member opinions voiced both for and against. Copies of the revised proposal along with the contractor license and contract are attached.

John Morris, Chair of Finance, said the committee met for the purpose of making recommendations regarding funding the re-carpet project. As of 5/13/14, there is \$6,945 in pledges, with \$2000 pledged from the UMM. The Finance Committee looked at paying the balance with current cash on hand; pulling funds from the stock account; or not replacing the carpet at this time. The Finance Committee recommends raising \$4205 from the Congregation, with \$13,150 coming from a mix of the Capital Reserve, Capital Improvement, and stocks.

David Bailey moved to accept the Finance Committee recommendations and to try to raise the money over the next ninety days. The motion was seconded and passed.

Krystal Cofer moved to ask the congregation to raise the money over the next two months, and if raised, proceed; if not, return to contractor for a lesser grade carpet. The motion was seconded and failed.

Ruth Allyn moved that if the money is raised, to proceed with the project to re-carpet and tile the Sanctuary. The motion was seconded and passed by majority vote.

- B. Praise Team Leader: Position is still open, applications being accepted.
- C. TUMC Vital Congregations Working Committee: David Bailey is working on it, meeting to be determined.
- D. Media Technology: Date TBD.
- E. Securing Church Building: David Bailey said he has spoken with all parties and has turned the issue over to the Trustees. Maurice Linkous is getting a list of who has keys.

New Business:

- A. Lay Leadership/Nominations: Reverend Keezel said the Chair position of Buildings and Grounds is open, and the Lay Leadership Committee will work on filling the position. She said the committee itself needs updating to include Maurice Linkous, Harold Saunders, Diane Springfield, Kavita Darji, Tom Wallace, and Carolyn Wilson. Cindy Shelton moved to approve the Lay Leadership Committee membership as proposed by Rev. Keezel. The motion was seconded and passed.
- B. New Folks: Reverend Keezel passed around name cards to "adopt a member."
- C. Missions: Deborah Napolitano discussed the following:
 - i. One Harvest is scheduled for 6/21/14; it will open to the public from 8:30 – 10:30 a.m. Volunteers helping need to arrive between 7:15-7:30 a.m. We are listed on the One Harvest website, soon OH will have a link on ours.

- ii. Fairy Godmother project: This Richmond-area outreach supports pediatric cancer patients and their families by providing meals and support. Participation with this project is still being planned.
- iii. Young at Heart: Since TUMC has a number of senior members that are not part of a small group such as Sunday School, Deborah is looking into starting a fellowship group for mature adults. Still in planning stages.

D. Upcoming Events: Make sure you are putting any event and/or need for the van on the church calendar. Upcoming dates: Youth Sunday 5/18; Endowment meeting 5/27 at 7:00 p.m.; Children's Sunday 6/1/14; Vacation Bible School in June; adult mission trip in August.

Committee Reports: If the committee is not listed, there was no report.

- A. Staff Parish: SPP have met, working on staff team work and delegation.
- B. Trustees: Maurice Linkous, newly elected chair reported: the Trustees met 4/24/14, in the process of reviewing insurance policy, reviewing Child Protection Policy, working on the van policy. If any changes made, they will be brought back to the Administrative Council.
- C. Finance Committee: Report attached. Spending is behind budget for the year, but utilities is already at 71% of budget. Contributions are ahead of budget. The annual audit will be completed by 6/30 – make sure you give your books to the Audit Committee. The Endowment Committee was established in 2012 but have never met, kick-off meeting scheduled for 5/27. Also, the Finance Committee is looking for another member.
- D. United Methodist Women: Working on kits for conference.
- E. Worship: Next meeting 6/3 at 7:30 p.m. to plan summer.
- F. UMYF: Youth Sunday 5/18, one service at 10:00 a.m.
- G. Family/Church Social Ministries: Still no chair for this committee; Reverend Keezel said they are looking for adult help in the kitchen on 6/1 for the Children's Play.
- H. Children's Ministry: Children fellowship on Friday 5/16, need volunteers for VBS 6/23-27 from 6-8:30 p.m.
- I. Sunday School: Mary Palmer reported working on Promotion Sunday and summer plans.
- J. Young Adults and At Large: Turner Wilkes mentioned that Trinity's largest youth group graduated high school four years ago and now are graduating college.
- K. Pastor Report: All three church computers run Microsoft XP which is not being supported any longer by anti-virus programs. One replacement is being donated, one is funded. It was suggested that the person donating the one for the secretary evaluate the needs of the Pastor re: laptop vs. desktop, programs, etc. Reverend Keezel said that nursery helpers are needed at the 11:00 service, and the kids will go to the nursery following the children's time in the service. Rev. Keezel will be off week of 6/15, and said there will be lay speakers at both 6/15 and 6/22 services.

There being no other business, the meeting adjourned with prayer.

The next Administrative Council meeting will be 7/15/14.
