PASTOR'S CORNER:

REV. TERESA KEEZEL

I am the resurrection and the life

Some people think that the church is in the business of selling death insurance. I heard a comment from someone who started attending worship at an older age say that their child wondered if they attended church because they were preparing to die. Some people keep church membership (even though they do not attend) because they want someone to bury them. Some people equate church rolls with entrance into heaven. But this is not how it works!

I am the resurrection and the life; He who believes in me, though he be dead, yet shall he will live.

The resurrection isn't primarily about graves; it is about life, abundant life. It is that the Christ is promising a life force that cannot be stopped. When the life of the everlasting God dwells in us, the spirit keeps us alive. The spirit keeps us going. When days are painful; when life is disappointing and crushing, God keeps us going. Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 4: "We have this treasure in earthen vessels to show that the transcendent power belongs to God and not to us. We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair, persecuted but not forsaken, struck down, but not destroyed; always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be manifested in our bodies. For while we live we are always being given up to death for Jesus's sake so that the life of Jesus may be manifested in our mortal flesh. So death is at work in us, but life in you."

This season of Lent and Easter is about remembering that in life and in death, nothing can separate us from the love and power of God. We as a congregation are carrying all kinds of burdens. We have worries and struggles and hardships. Salvation does not begin when we our mortal bodies die, it begins when life challenges to undo us. So we celebrate life after death: failing a test, having the wrong words come out of our mouth, losing a job, friendships changing and ending, and yes, the transition from the visible(flesh) to the invisible(spiritual) kingdom. Life we recreate after life's events break and disappoint us.

Be of good cheer. Live in hope. God is with you and always will be. Teresa

Why the food pantry at Meadowbrook High School? There are over 1600 students with minority enrollment at 90%. It's test scores are below the average for Chesterfield County. In some cases, far below. There are many at risk students. It is hard for a student to learn when he/she has had no breakfast and has little prospect for lunch.

Some of the peanut butter or cheese crackers, granola bars and protein bars are distributed directly to the clinic. When a student comes in with a headache or stomach ache due to not eating, the clinic aide feeds him/her and sends him/her back to class, to learn! The alternative is to send the student home where there is probably very little food.

Most of the food goes into the food pantry. A hungry student is now able to fill his/her belly with breakfast and lunch. The food pantry is also sending home food for the families of these students! We are servicing this community, the same community as Sherbourne, by using a different method.

Won't you please help us eradicate hunger by either donating funds designated Meadowbrook or by putting a little extra in your grocery cart each week? For the month of March our food focus is cereal and pop tarts.
