(Making Disciples continued from page 1)



MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT

DISASTER RECOVERY

The mission (construction) team has been made up of members from both services. Thanks to Stephanie Griffith and Karen Poole for their team-building efforts to help our church family get to know each other better while we serve God's people.

We sent 15 members to Virginia Beach from September 17-20 to repair a flood-damaged home there. We stayed at a Methodist church that has been converted to a mission team "bunkhouse" complete with kitchen, bunks and showers in a tractor-trailer in the parking lot. We installed floor tile in the kitchen, painted, sanded floors to remove drywall mud and paint drops, patched rotten sheathing on the rear of the house and installed new vinyl siding on about half of the home.

JEFFERSON DAVIS HIGHWAY

The Trinity Girl Scout Troop will be building and stocking 6 "Little Libraries" along the Jefferson Davis Highway Corridor. Our church members filled the large bin in the narthex twice and the girls have set collection boxes at two schools. One girl has received approval from the Girl Scout Council and the other 2 are working on their approvals. The girls hope to secure locations for the libraries by the end of October and begin construction in November.

Trinity's Boy Scout Troop has assisted a lady with yard work and painting.

We have provided wagons to the Empowered Warriors group in Shady Hill. The wagons are being used to help families move groceries and laundry between the stores, laundromats and their homes. We have offered to provide volunteer drivers (either in our personal vehicles or with the church van) once they are prepared to use that service.

Several of us have worked at "A Place of Miracles Café" at I-95/Willis Road. We have been providing fresh fruit for their Friday night food bag program. We are also helping to organize the food bag distribution and driving a few people home with their food. We are working there from 4:30 – 7:00PM on Friday nights. **We could use additional volunteers to help with this work. Please contact Bill or Karen Poole or Lana Lefforts if you are interested.**

UNITED METHODIST FAMILY SERVICES

Trinity has been visiting the boys and girls at UMFS every 6 weeks for several years. UMFS has cancelled this program as of the September 1 visit. The visitation was stopped once before and was started up again after several months. Let's pray that UMFS will again allow our members to minister to the boys and girls in their care.

LOCAL ASSISTANCE

Food was collected over the summer and delivered to the Chesterfield Food Bank. As school has started, we will once again be providing food to Meadowbrook High School.

We provided school supplies for 19 students at Bellwood Elementary School.

We provided food and toiletries to day-workers living at the Colonial Inn in Colonial Heights. Several of them have major health issues that prevent them from working every day and, if they can't work, they don't get paid.

We continue to provide toiletries and gift cards to the CARES Shelter in Petersburg. New residents who often do not bring necessities with them use these items.

We have provided food bags to low income cancer patients that are being driven to treatments by the American Cancer Society's "Road to Recovery" program. **See Karen Poole if you are interested in driving patients for treatments.**

Cookie Baking Instructions and Recipes

Recipes are furnished as a guide only. You can use any recipe you desire. **It is, however, very important not to use icing, sugar, or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookies, or to add any kind of fruit to the cookies.**

Cookies should be approximately 2 to 2 ½ inches in size.

Package cookies 12 to a quart size zip lock bag.

Please indicate the type of cookie on each bag.

DO NOT package HOT cookies. Let them cool. They may be made weeks ahead of time and frozen – they still turn out perfect.

Easy Cookies

2 packages white or yellow cake mix*	1 cup cooking oil
4 teaspoons water	4 eggs
2 cups (12 oz pkg) flavored chips*	2 cups rolled oats

Preheat 350 degrees. Blend cake mix, water, oil, and eggs. Stir in chips and oatmeal. Place cookie dough in refrigerator about one hour. Drop by heaping teaspoons (to make 2" cookies) onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 8 minutes (top will look pale). Cool on sheet 1 minute and remove to wire rack. Completely cool before packaging.

******You can use any flavored chips (chocolate, peanut butter, swirled, toffee, etc.) but nothing like M&Ms, Reese's Pieces, etc. You can also use chocolate cake mix or strawberry and lemon cake mixes.

Peanut Butter

3/4 cup Creamy Peanut Butter	1 egg
1/2 cup Crisco Shortening	1-3/4 cup all-purpose flour
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar	3/4 teaspoon salt
3 tablespoons milk	3/4 teaspoon baking soda
baking soda	1 teaspoon vanilla

Combine peanut butter, shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl and mix at medium speed until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add flour mixture to peanut butter and mix until just blended. Drop by heaping teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet and flatten slightly in a crisscross pattern with the tines of a fork. Bake at 375 degrees for 7 to 8 minutes until set. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

Chewy Oatmeal

3/4 cup butter flavor Crisco	3 cups quick cooking oats
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar	1 cup all purpose flour
1 egg	1/2 teaspoon salt
1/3 cup milk	1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1-1/2 teaspoon vanilla	1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

Combine Crisco, brown sugar, egg, milk and vanilla in a large bowl. Mix at medium speed until well blended. Combine oats, flour, salt, baking soda and cinnamon in a separate bowl, mix well. Add to Crisco/sugar mixture until just blended. Drop rounded tablespoons of dough onto cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes 2-1/2 dozen cookies.

Chocolate Chip

3/4 cup Crisco shortening	1-3/4 cup all
purpose flour	
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar	1 teaspoon salt
2 tablespoons milk	3/4 teaspoon
baking soda	
1 teaspoon vanilla	1 cup semi-
sweet choc chips	
	1 egg

Combine shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl, mix until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add to shortening/sugar mixture until well blended. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop by rounded tablespoon onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes for chewy cookies or 11 to 13 minutes for crisp cookies. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

Molasses Cookies

3/4 cup margarine or shortening	1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 cup granulated sugar	1 teaspoon ginger
1 egg	2 cups flour
4 tablespoons molasses	2 teaspoons baking
soda	

In a large bowl, cream margarine or shortening with sugar. Add egg and blend. Add molasses and spices; mix well. Add flour and baking soda and blend. Chill dough 30 minutes or overnight (covered tightly). Shape dough into small balls and place 2-inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 10-12 minutes. Remove from oven and cool on wire racks. Makes 2 1/2 dozen.

Sugar Cookies

1 cup margarine (or butter); (2 sticks) at room temperature	1 teaspoon vanilla
1 cup vegetable oil	4 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup granulated sugar	1 teaspoon salt
1 cup powdered sugar	1 teaspoon baking soda
2 eggs	1 teaspoon cream of tartar

Beat together margarine, oil, granulated sugar, powdered sugar, eggs and vanilla. Sift together flour, salt, baking soda and cream of tartar. Add dry ingredients to margarine mixture. Drop from a teaspoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees until cookies are light brown around the edges, about 8 to 10 minutes (watch closely; cookies will be dry if they get too brown). Makes approximately 5 dozen.
