

### **CCHASM (Chesterfield-Colonial Heights Alliance for Social Ministry) THANKSGIVING (Bob Cassada and Deborah Napolitano)**

We're running the information about CCHASM food bags again this month. Thanksgiving is almost here so please do not forget those in need. CCHASM's goal is to serve 3,000 families by providing the following items for Thanksgiving dinner. We will be collecting bags from Sunday, November 5th through Sunday, November 12th. ### **Bellwood Elementary School (Deborah Napolitano)**

Bellwood Elementary School is one of the poorest schools in the county with many children living in poverty. Typically, Trinity sponsors several children for Christmas. This year, there will not be a list of names in the office or on a clipboard. If you wish to sponsor a child, contact me at [allmynaps@gmail.com](mailto:allmynaps@gmail.com) or 386-8555 no later than November 12<sup>th</sup>. I will get children for everybody who volunteers to support a child. Our UMW is generously sponsoring some children. I challenge the UMM to do the same! If you do not want to shop, put a check in the offering designated Bellwood and let me know to expect it. It takes \$125.00 to sponsor each child. These children are prescreened and are not double-dipping with social services or other churches. Trinity has always been generous with the least of these.

### **Envoy Nursing Home (Deborah Napolitano)**

Envoy Nursing Home is a predominantly Medicaid facility. There are many elderly residents that do not have the extras. Our Angels children's music group asks that you help by bringing in slippers for men and women, any size, throw blankets and new or gently used sweaters. Trinity has always been generous with the least of these.

### **CARES SHELTER (Bill and Karen Poole)**

The CARES shelter is located in Petersburg and has historically been a haven for battered women and their children. Recently, they have also been providing shelter for homeless women and children. Trinity has typically spent \$4500 - \$6000 to provide Christmas for 20 – 35 women and children. We also give CARES workers a \$25 gift card for the support they give the women and children throughout the year. If there is any additional money, we give the shelter director \$25 Wal-Mart gift cards that she can give to women and children that move into the shelter with little or no personal items. This mission is funded entirely by donations from current and former members of Trinity. If you wish to support this part of Trinity's ministry, please place your check in the offering plate no later than December 10<sup>th</sup> with "CARES" in the memo line. We will be shopping and wrapping gifts on Saturday December 16<sup>th</sup>. Trinity has always been generous with the least of these.

### **Jefferson Davis Highway projects**

### **Little Libraries (Sue Makin)**

Three of our Girl Scouts are working on this project. They are making headway with the approvals from the Girl Scout Council. Sue is meeting with Kim Marble, President-elect of the Jefferson Davis Association, to firm up the 6 Little Library sites.

## **A Place of Miracles Café (Lana Lefferts, Karen and Bill Poole)**

There was a World War II song, “Comin’ in on a Wing and a Prayer”, written about a shot-up B-17 limping back to base in England, and miraculously landing safely.

A wing and a prayer accurately describes the ministry at A Place of Miracles Café. They provide free meals 4 nights a week, weekend food bags, school supplies, toiletry kits, household items, etc...all free of charge. They have a strong network of food providers including the Chesterfield Food Bank, Panera Bread, Olive Garden, Kroger, etc. If you shop at these places, please thank them for supporting the Café.

Volunteers run the Café, and willing hands are needed every time they are serving their “parishioners”. There other big need is money to keep the doors open. Their typical Friday night dinner is pizza. Last Friday they had to change to crockpot spaghetti because they were late paying their gas bill and service had been shut off...no gas = no pizza oven. Trinity recently provided money for their November electric bill.

If you want to get involved, see Lana or the Poole's for more information about volunteer opportunities or put a check in the offering plate with “A Place of Miracles” on the memo line.

The Café also provides crockpots to families living in nearby motels that do not have kitchen facilities. With a crockpot, families can prepare a hot meal for themselves. You can drop off crockpots in the Narthex or give them to Lana or the Poole's.

Kairos Follow Up for Kairos 68  
Weekend Oct 19 thru Oct 22, 2017!!

WOW!! There have now been 68 Kairos's held in GRCC since Pastor Paul Beighley (a Methodist Preacher) brought the Kairos program to Greensville some 12 years ago. Kairos has spread to all 3 units in the prison impacting about 700 inmates. Glory be to GOD!!! What a moving of the Holy Spirit DURING Kairos 68 at Greensville Correctional Center, Jarratt Virginia. God Bless everyone at Trinity for making the cookies ... 120 dozen, Cookies that were prayed over and used to serve our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The volunteer team had 25 people from the outside and 42 candidates from the inside of the Prison plus about 15 Servants on the inside who played music, Lead the singing and worship during the weekend. At the Closing, there were 250 in the Kairos Community who came and participated. 50 folks from the outside Kairos Community and 200 from the inside. The S2 unit that I am involved in has about 1200 inmates. The whole prison S1, S2, and S3 house about 3600 prisoners. Several inmates gave their life to Christ during the 4 day weekend. PRAISE GOD!!! There were 4 Methodist Preachers involved over the weekend that gave some powerful witnessing talks ... Please Consider Teaming next year in April 2018 or volunteering in other ways. God will bless you beyond your wildest dreams!! God Bless You and May Trinity continue to work transforming lives for Jesus Christ in this powerful Ministry, called Kairos!!!!
