Fun with the IRS

The world has changed. Much that use to be is no more. Plucking chickens and quiet blue law Sundays. Tax codes have changed as well.

We are trying to get a handle on what this means for the church. We are working on the wording that Conference is handing down to us as well as CPA's are sorting through.

Conference has told us that that local church has a tax id number. We do. For giving to the church to be counted as tax exempt, the funds must be given to the church. The funds must also be approved as an official church mission by the Church Council. So we have asked all our committee chairs to bring any non-budget items to Council for certification. Then the Finance Committee will set up a special giving line for this amount.

As well, as you know, if you get anything in exchange for the money, the funds are not tax exempt. When you purchase stew or pumpkins, these are not tax deductible under the church id number.

As the Finance Committee continues to work on the wording for special offering, we will keep you in the loop. We want people to get all the tax savings that one can. We are also trying to comply with the IRS.
