Friday, October 19 and Saturday, October 20, will be the days for the annual Fellowship Class apple butter event at Trinity. On Friday we will meet in the kitchen at 3:30 to turn 12 bushels of apples into applesauce. Please plan to join us and take a turn turning the cranks on the Squeeze food mills and watch beautiful, healthy applesauce flow into the pans. On Saturday we will set up 2 copper kettles in the front yard at 7 a.m. and begin stirring the copper kettles with large wooden paddles - - all ages welcomed. The cost will be \$6.00 a pint, and it should be ready by 4 p.m. If you have any empty pint jars sitting around - - even just 1 or 2 - - we would love to have them. 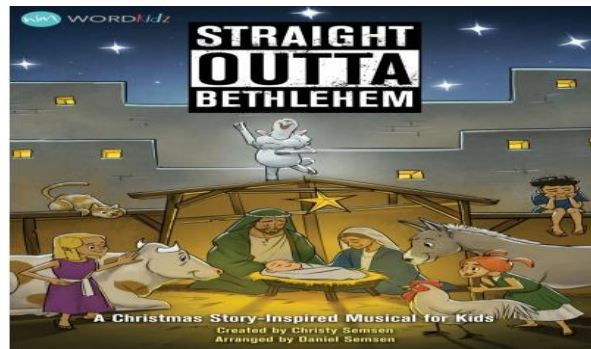

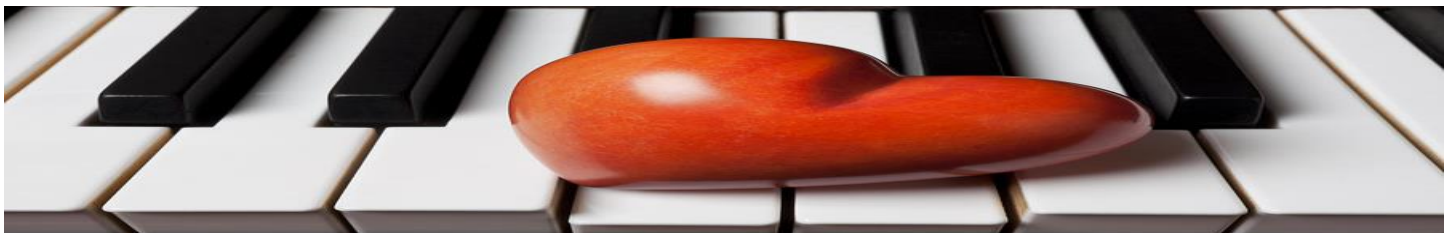

BRUNSWICK STEW

BRUNSWICK STEW TO BE SOLD ON OCTOBER 6TH

The UNITED METHODIST MEN will be doing their annual fund raiser of cooking and selling BRUNSWICK STEW on SATURDAY, OCTOBER 6TH. This is our major fund raiser of the year and usually raises over \$3,000 to help support our annual contribution of \$5,000 to missions and the church. We can use all the help available for cutting up the vegetables and meat on Friday, the 5TH of October, starting at 5 P.M. and the cooking and packing of the stew on Saturday, the 6TH of October. We plan on cooking 3 Kettles of stew (over 600 quarts), so will need at least 12 individuals to stir the stew from 7 A.M. until about 1 P.M. when we begin to pack the stew for pickup and sale!!

For the fifth year, We will be pre-selling the stew for \$8.00 a quart until October 5th, and \$9.00 a quart for walk-up sales on Saturday, October 6th. If you would like to buy any of this "Southern Delicacy", please sign up on the clip boards passed through the congregation during Church Services. The Trinity Men thoroughly appreciate all of your support of this very important fund raiser.

PumpkinPatch

The very busy month of October has arrived, and with it the Methodist Women and the Methodist Men are selling Pumpkins and Mums for the entire month. This is a very important month as it is a major Fund Raiser for the Men, Women and the Church. We are able to raise about seven to eight thousand dollars (if the weather cooperates) for the month which is divided equally among the three groups! We had a great turnout (11 men, 5 women and 6 youth) on Sunday to help set up the tent and prepare the yard for the arrival of the pumpkins on Wednesday, 26 September! We are very fortunate that the Children parents have agreed to work Wednesday evenings, as have the Sojourner's Sunday school class volunteered Friday evening and the Youth parents are working Sunday evenings. This will only leave Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday to be manned by other Church members. Anne Wright and Barbara Smith of the Trinity Women will be setting up the weekly schedule for these days and the early afternoons for the other days. We appreciate the members of the congregation taking the time to help us in this fund raiser. Betty Sawyer has agreed to prepare the publicity. MISSION FUND RAISING MARATHON

October is a mission fund raising marathon. As we begin this month, we are reaching out into our community inviting them into our mission and ministry.

As you know, our pumpkin truck arrived this week. Along with ourselves, we invite our scouts to join us in unloading the over 2000 pumpkins that come our way.



The congregation partners with the men's and women's groups to sell pumpkins the entire month. The proceeds are then divided between the men's and women's groups with a tithe going into the local church budget. These mission money's fund such groups are Miracle Café, CHASSM, UMW missionaries, and more.

During the month other activities join the festivities. On October 5th and 6th, the men hold the autumn Brunswick stew. If you are interested in helping cut vegetables, please contact John Morris (777-9163) Friday night is the big cutting extravaganza. Then the stirring begins in the morning.

That same day, in the evening, our youth try out their “haunting of the woods”. This is new to us this year. Our youth group has almost doubled. In order to raise extra funds to help send them on mission trips and spiritual retreats. On the evening of the sixth from 7 til 10 our church members can try the woods out for \$1 apiece.

Then for the next three weekend on Friday and on Saturday night we will be open for the public. For \$5.00 people can tromp thru our woods and be spooked! At the end will be a bon fire and concessions.

On the weekend of the 20th all kinds of mission fund raising explodes. Friday night debuts the beginning of the indoor Youth fall yard sale. The yard sale will run through Saturday afternoon. Starting on Friday night as well, our ‘Fellowship’ class holds their annual apple butter event. Friday night will be cutting, cooking, and preparing; Saturday morning the stirring begins.

As the apple butter finishes cooking, the children’s ministry Harvest Festival begins. Games, candy, and laughter will fill the church grounds as little spookables run everywhere.

Again, once the spookables go home, filled with candy and laughter, the youth and those who want to help them restart “the woods.”

The youth will haunt each week end plus on Halloween.

So....when the pumpkin patch closes on the 31st of October, so will the woods. For All Saints Day, Trinity will return to a mild, regular church.....

So put on your running shoes....find yourself a comfortable chair.... And please join in the fun.

But listening and being heard is one of the greatest paths to healing. Having someone listen to us can often help us discover our next steps. So.... we will be working out schedules to offer gathering times to help us listen better. The times will be scheduled for both the day and evening times and will be for no more than 2 hours. This way you can choose what time best fits your schedule. As well, we will be looking at scheduling times for the topics of Christian caring, helping people move through grief, depression, divorce, loss related to aging, and helping people and families work thru the dying process. We hope to schedule the gathering times throughout the next 12 months.

Thank you for your input. We hope that you will help us refine the process as we go. And we hope that these help all of us as we grow in being able to reach out and to help people in some of the most painful segments of living.

We are streaming!

It is official Trinity, we are streaming. In fact, we have been for about a month now. It is exciting, scary, overwhelming, and most of all progress. Now, as we are still in the infancy of this I wanted to take the time to answer some questions for those that are nervous about this “great unknown”.

1) Why do we need to stream?

We have made it this far without streaming, why start now? Well, this is true; but streaming has benefits. Over the last few weeks, we have had around twenty people watch the service live; and that is just live. The streams can still be watched at any time, to which we have been getting even more views and on average over a hundred people looking further into our page to see what Trinity is about. While they don't have faces these are people that want to see what we are about. This entire process was put in motion as a means of reaching our Shut-ins. Now you don't have to tell me that many of them do not have Facebook, and I knew this before deciding this route. However, many of us do have Facebook, and how glorious of a ministry is it for us to share it with those that don't or can't. So if you are visiting a Shut-in and know they would like to see or just hear the service, share that gift with them.

2) What if we don't want to be on camera?

This is one of those situations where we cannot please everyone. Sorry. I have had some approach me about concerns that the church looks empty in our recordings. While this is true, we also have many that do not want to be seen on camera, and we don't want people

that are physically attending service to feel uncomfortable while worshipping.

So currently we are placing the camera where it picks up the minister and the music (the praise team at this time but eventually the choir as well). By far the biggest hurdle we have is “child protection”; it is an unavoidable issue. We will try our best to not show children, but there will be sometimes where we can’t avoid it. For those that have watched the streams this is why the camera goes toward the cross during children’s time. So the good news from this is that in true Methodist fashion, I have officially given the congregation a legitimate excuse to actually sit in the back row. You are welcome.

3) What should you be aware of?

Well first and foremost, we are out there; and thanks to George and Karen Kingsley moving cross country, we have regular viewers on the west coast. While I do want the congregation to know 90% of the Church will not be seen, the remaining 10% is what reflects on the church. So be mindful of what image we want to give of our church. Do we want people to see smiling welcoming faces, or faces that seem less than thrilled? However, in all fairness we should have been mindful of this even without cameras. Secondly, don’t be offended when we force a microphone on you as you lift up prayer concerns, joys, announcements, etc.. This is not so you can be heard in the sanctuary, it is so you can be heard in Oregon. With that there are sections of the service that we will not be streaming. Currently we are not starting the stream until after “passing of the peace”, just in case we have sensitive topics to address that we don’t want broadcasted. Finally, we are looking for help. Teresa has already expressed that she is not thrilled with how much of her talking is in these streams, so if you are interested in reading scripture, prayer of confession, and other liturgy, please reach out. As well this gives our people at the sound booth added duties, if you have an interest in helping out there, please reach out.

I for one am excited as to what this opens us up to, and if you have questions please do ask me. I can tell you that one or two of the views post streaming are me. I am watching despite being there in person, trying to find ways to tweak, adjust, and fix whatever problems we are having. Most of all, as scary as it is, this is an amazing way to show how God is working at Trinity. Thank you for being a part of that.

Cookie Baking Instructions and Recipes

Recipes are furnished as a guide only. You can use any recipe you desire. *It is, however, very important not to use icing, sugar, or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookies, or to add any kind of fruit to the cookies.*

Cookies should be approximately 2 to 2 ½ inches in size.

Package cookies 12 to a quart size zip lock bag.

Please indicate the type of cookie on each bag.

DO NOT package HOT cookies. Let them cool. They may be made weeks ahead of time and frozen – they still turn out perfect.

Easy Cookies

2 packages white or yellow cake mix*
4 teaspoons water
2 cups (12 oz pkg) flavored chips*

1 cup cooking oil
4 eggs
2 cups rolled oats

Preheat 350 degrees. Blend cake mix, water, oil, and eggs. Stir in chips and oatmeal. Place cookie dough in refrigerator about one hour. Drop by heaping teaspoons (to make 2" cookies) onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 for 8 minutes (top will look pale). Cool on sheet 1 minute and remove to wire rack. Completely cool before packaging.

**You can use any flavored chips (chocolate, peanut butter, swirled, toffee, etc.) but nothing like M&Ms, Reese's Pieces, etc. You can also use chocolate cake mix or strawberry and lemon cake mixes.

Peanut Butter

3/4 cup Creamy Peanut Butter
1/2 cup Crisco Shortening
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
3 tablespoons milk

1 egg
1-3/4 cup all-purpose flour
3/4 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1 teaspoon vanilla

Combine peanut butter, shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl and mix at medium speed until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add flour mixture to peanut butter and mix until just blended. Drop by heaping teaspoons onto ungreased cookie sheet and flatten slightly in a crisscross pattern with the tines of a fork. Bake at 375 degrees for 7 to 8 minutes until set. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

Chewy Oatmeal

3/4 cup butter flavor Crisco
oats
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
flour
1 egg
1/3 cup milk
soda
1-1/2 teaspoon vanilla
cinnamon

3 cups quick cooking
1 cup all-purpose
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon baking
1/2 teaspoon

Combine Crisco, brown sugar, egg, milk and vanilla in a large bowl. Mix at medium speed until well blended. Combine oats, flour, salt, baking soda and cinnamon in a separate bowl, mix well. Add to Crisco/sugar mixture until just blended. Drop rounded tablespoons of dough onto cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 12 minutes or until lightly browned. Makes 2-1/2 dozen cookies.

Chocolate Chip

3/4 cup Crisco shortening
1-1/4 cup firmly packed brown sugar
2 tablespoons milk
1 teaspoon vanilla

1-3/4 cup all-purpose flour
1 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon baking soda
1 cup semi-sweet choc chips
1 egg

Combine shortening, sugar, milk and vanilla in a large bowl, mix until well blended. Add egg and mix well. In a separate bowl combine flour, salt and baking soda, mix well. Add to shortening/sugar mixture until well blended. Stir in chocolate chips. Drop by rounded tablespoon onto ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 8 to 10 minutes for chewy cookies or 11 to 13 minutes for crisp cookies. Makes 3 dozen cookies.

Molasses Cookies

3/4 cup margarine or shortening
1 cup granulated sugar
1 egg
4 tablespoons molasses
soda

1 teaspoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon ginger
2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking

In a large bowl, cream margarine or shortening with sugar. Add egg and blend. Add molasses and spices; mix well. Add flour and baking soda and blend. Chill dough 30 minutes or overnight (covered tightly). Shape dough into small balls and place 2-inches apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 325 degrees for 10-12 minutes. Remove from oven and cool on wire racks. Makes 2 1/2 dozen.

Sugar Cookies

1 cup margarine (or butter); (2 sticks) at-room temperature
1 cup vegetable oil
4 cups all-purpose flour
1 cup granulated sugar
1 cup powdered sugar
1 teaspoon baking soda
2 eggs
1 teaspoon cream of tartar
1 teaspoon vanilla
1 teaspoon salt

Beat together margarine, oil, granulated sugar, powdered sugar, eggs and vanilla. Sift together flour, salt, baking soda and cream of tartar. Add dry ingredients to margarine mixture. Drop from a teaspoon onto greased cookie sheet. Bake at 350 degrees until cookies are light brown around the edges, about 8 to 10 minutes (watch closely; cookies will be dry if they get too brown). Makes approximately 5 dozen.
