August Calendar

What type of church are we?

As I said last month, we are a congregation who sees ourselves as servants. We are called to help people. We do not feel called to save people's souls from hell. Our scores are low on evangelism. We do not feel called to produce disciples that quote scripture and go out to tell people what the Scriptures say. Our scores on teaching are low. What we did score high on is servanthood (463). This is our highest score.

Servanthood 463
Healing 209
Compassion 191

When we look at our other high scores, we get to see what types of servanthood to which we are called. We care about people. Our score for Healing is 209 and Compassion is 191. We acknowledge that we want to help people. We care and have kind hearts. Just look at all the mission projects we keep going: supplies for school children; food for those who do not have enough and have to choose between medicine and food; food and hygiene bags for anyone who stops by the church; homeless mats and prayer shawls for us to go and handout to anyone who needs; trips (day trips and longer trips) to repair homes and rebuild lives; And our Route One Corridor Ministry that we will talk more about later. In support of our ministry of healing and compassion, this fall we will be holding a workshop on how to visit.

We will look once again at cards, food, communion, and visits. The visits may be in person or may be by mail. As well we will asking mission coordinators to come and share with us. How do we grow in living out our call to be caring and compassionate and facilitate healing?

The next highest concentration was the gift of Interpretation (247). We have a heart for building bridges with other ages and cultures. Look at the job we do with our children and youth. Reaching out to them, we fund Sunday school, weekly programs, monthly activities and yearly events. We support local and distant mission projects. These include trips to Lucy Corr and Youth

Mission projects out of state. This includes workshops in music and retreats on how to share our faith. Our love and concern also reaches out beyond ourselves to other cultures. The church invests various resources towards the Route One Corridor.

Whether it is at Miracle Café or Sherbourne UMC; be it at Bellwood Elementary or local trailer parks, we invest thousands of dollars and all kinds of hours building relationships and ministries with people from different cultures and walks of life. Always looking for how we can serve, we continue to discover new ways to share the love of Christ with people.

The next highest score is Shepherding (166) and Exhortation or encouragement (171). As we partner with our young adults in how to grow into new ministries and invite them to join in with existing ministries, we keep trying to grow disciples. In the coming months, Lay Leadership Committee is working to bring in a workshop trainer to help us explore other options and skills in shepherding. Upon reading about generational differences, one of the encouraging reports is that young people enjoy mentoring.

To Our Friends at Trinity United Methodist Church:

It's hard to believe it was only three months ago that we decided to look into moving to Oregon. Right from the beginning we felt that if the time was right the Lord would lead us on the right path. The sale of our home went quickly ~ sold in three days and above our asking price. We took our time traveling across country [5 to 6 hours driving time per day for a total of about 43 hours driving time ~ about 2990 total miles] and we quickly found a one month rental apartment that met our needs while we looked at homes in the area. When our agent learned of a home going on the market that day we scheduled a showing for that afternoon and made a full price offer. The owners accepted that day and we had all our household things in storage delivered on June 15th.

The community, Creekside of Hillsboro, is very similar to a 55+ modular home community, however there are a few younger families ~ about 80% of this community are 55+.

When we arrived in Oregon it was a couple days before Mother's Day and I was able to spend my day with our son, Patrick and on Father's Day George and Patrick were able to spend the day together for the first time in almost 30 years! Patrick took George to the Evergreen Air and Space Museum.

We are beginning the process of slowly getting our things set up in our home.

We have found a very nice church, Christ United Methodist Church, a few miles away that has a similar feel as Trinity.

Once again, thank you for keeping us in your thoughts and prayers.

STEPHEN MINISTER

I was trained as a Stephen Minister and then a Stephen Leader while a member of New Town UMC in Williamsburg. I believe Stephen Ministry would greatly benefit not only Trinity's congregation but the surrounding community and I've been praying about starting this ministry at Trinity.

Stephen Ministers are lay people trained by a Stephen Leader to provide one-to-one, Christ-centered care. They have a compassionate heart for those who are hurting, and they're equipped with caring ministry skills by their congregation's Stephen Leaders. A Stephen Minister typically has one care receiver at a time and meets with that person once a week to listen, care, pray, encourage, and offer emotional and spiritual support. There are always many more people in need of care, both in the congregation and in the community, than a pastor alone can care for. This is a quiet ministry, with extreme confidentiality between the Stephen Ministers and their Care Receivers. Feel free to contact me for more information.

During Sunday school the week of the 12th, all those who are able are invited to walk around the building and pray for Trinity, it's ministries, it's people, and our witness for God. We will start as a group over where we have our Sunrise Services and then encircle the building. We will have a printed prayer for us to pray together. For those who are unable to walk around the building, we invite them to either sit outside or to sit in the Sunday school rooms and join us.

I know that ya'll are as hurt and shocked as I am. We all need prayer: for ourselves, for the person who did this and their healing, and for Darcie and her family. May God bless our faithful attempt to bring healing.
