September Calendar

Where might God be calling us? One of the options that we have been exploring is a community center. A place in our community where non-church people can gather in God's space. A place for basketball or volleyball or pickle ball. A place for plays or community meetings or dinners. A place to come and walk or.....? Several people have been visiting churches. Exploration is underway and the group will be again getting back with the congregation for more feedback and suggestions. In the meantime, a donation of \$50,000 was given to the effort. So, we do not know where God is leading us, but we are explorers into God's dreams. Stay tune for more participation.

HOW CAN I AVOID PUNISHMENT?

How can I avoid punishment? As we begin to learn, before we even have the ability to realize that we are learning, we shape an understanding in ourselves of what we should

and should not do. What is good and what is not good. As small children, we decide this based on how we are treated. Do we get praise or do we get scolded. Based on people's response to us, we determine what to repeat. If we are praised, this is good, right? If we get scolded or punished, this is bad, right? And when we are young, we equate good and bad behavior as us being good or bad people. Only as we mature are we able to discern the difference between a good or bad behavior and a good person doing a bad behavior. Small children do not recognize this difference. Many times, we do not either. When someone is not nice to us, we often ask: What did I do wrong? When someone appreciates something we do, we feel that we are good. And from before we are cognitive, these definitions of good and bad behaviors are ingrained into us. They get reshaped as we grow and as our peer groups change. At all ages we have a difficult time to separate out the difference between behavior and person.

God has decided that he loves us and declares each of us worthy. That we are of value. God's word tries to teach us the difference between good and bad behaviors. Good behaviors bring us closer to God and each other. Bad or sinful behaviors break our relationships with God and each other. Learning to separate the value of a person from their behaviors is one of the stages of maturing. In September and October, I will be working with the youth asking them to sort out what are the 'good' and 'bad' behaviors of their different groups. At home and with friends, what gets you praise and what gets you ostracized? We will coordinate these with healthy behaviors (sometimes people praise us for unhealthy actions and attitudes) and if and how these actions are portrayed in God's word. So parents, if ya'll can be talking at home about what are your family values, this would be super. As we work, hopefully you can interact with your youth on their perceptions and on your own. Looking forward to the fall.

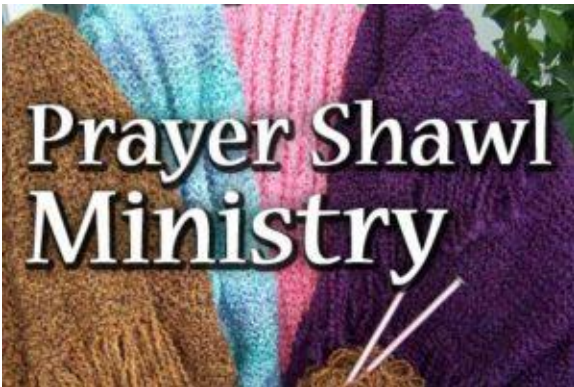
