## Route 1 corridor missions

### - January Food Focus

FOOD FOCUS for December will be peanut butter & jelly and soup & crackers. Again this food will be distributed to the residents along the Route 1 Jefferson Davis corridor during the last Friday of the month food distribution at the Miracle Cafe. The people in this area of Chesterfield are the poorest in the county including the top two highest percentage free & reduced lunch schools, Bensley and Bellwood.

### - A Place of Miracles Café

A Place of Miracles Cafe has moved to the Bellwood Baptist Church, 9138 Quinnford Boulevard (at the corner of Quinnford Boulevard and Willis Road). They are serving hot meals on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 5 - 7 PM. Grocery items are distributed on Friday evenings. We could still use crock pots for distribution to families that visit the Cafe. If you are interested in helping to prepare meals, please see Bill Poole. TUMC volunteers on January 4<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>. Jen Walker usually volunteers to prepare meals every Tuesday, if you would like to help her out one week, please see her.



We were able to raise over \$7,000 for CARES this year and were able to provide gifts for 25 people at the shelter. Thank you so very much for your generosity.
