

Proposal for Church at the Point- 1

Where is Poinciana?

It is located right in the middle of the state of FL. It is 90 minutes away from Melbourne as well as 90 minutes from the Tampa/St. Pete area. It is easily accessible from I-4 and the Florida TurnPike. Poinciana is shared by two counties, Osceola to its east and Polk to its west. Poinciana is not a town or a city, it is a community that is a part of Kissimmee FL. In 2007, Poinciana was the second largest planned unit development in the Country. In the year 2000 the US Census discovered that the population of Poinciana was at 13,647 people. In 2010 that number ballooned to 53,193 people which means that in the past ten years it has grown by more than 289.8%.

What is Poinciana?

Poinciana is a melting pot of diversity. The population is 22.6% Caucasian, 51.2% Hispanic, 24.5% African American, and 1.7% Other. Most of the Spanish speaking families have little to no training in the English language, so there is a widespread need for bi-lingual ministry in this area. They are often transplanted from native homelands, such as Puerto Rico or the Dominican Republic, or move from New York City. Most families have two or more generations living at home with only the children who go to school having the ability to speak English. According to research conducted by www.thearda.com in 2000, 40% of the population in Polk County claim to be Evangelical Christians while 20% of Osceola County claim to be the same. Also Osceola County claims that 122,357 of its population do not declare themselves as a part of a congregation.

Beliefs

We believe in one God, creator of all things, infinitely perfect and eternally existing in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (*Genesis 1:1,26,27; 3:22; Psalm 90:2; Matthew 28:19; 1 Peter 1:2; 2 Corinthians 13:14*)

We believe Jesus Christ is truly God and truly man. Jesus lived a sinless life, died on the cross as a sacrifice for our sins, arose bodily from the grave and ascended to heaven where He is our Advocate. (Matthew 1:22,23; Isaiah 9:6; John 1:1-5, 14:10-30; Hebrews 4:14,15; 1 Corinthians 15:3,4; Romans 1:3,4; Acts 1:9-11; 1 Timothy 6:14,15; Titus 2:13)

We believe that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the trinity and he exists to convict people of sin, regenerate the believing sinner, indwell, instruct, and empower the believer for Godly living and service. We believe in that Salvation is a gift from God. It is God's saving grace that calls all people to respond in faith through repentance, confession, baptism, and a new life and ministry through the Holy Spirit. (*Romans 6:23; Ephesians 2:8,9; John 14:6, 1:12; Titus 3:5; Galatians 3:26; Romans 5:1*)

We believe in the bodily resurrection of all humankind: the believer in Christ into everlasting joy, and the unbeliever into everlasting punishment. (*Matthew 22:29-32, Acts 4:1-3, Acts 24:14-16, Romans 6:4-6, 1 Corinthians 15:11-13*)

Implementation of the Church

Since I grew up in this community, I have a lot of relationships already built with the people there . We desire to be active in the community by doing multiple gatherings. We will hand out water bottles at local supermarkets and tell the people who we are. Then we would like to have several barbecues at area parks, and meet more of the community in this way. We will then have a movie night in the park, as well as other community gatherings on various weekends throughout the initial outreach process. We can then move into having home Bible studies while beginning to target our audience and meet the needs of the community. This will be an 8-12 month process of heavy investment into the people before launching the church.

We will also launch our marketing campaign that will send out mailers to every home within the community to let them know about these events as well as our launch date. We will meet with city officials and begin building relationships with them. We pray that through our bible studies with the people that we can then move forth with developing key leaders that we will need to have in place for the launch.
