A word from our Executive Director

Well, we have come to the last month of 2014! As we all prepare ourselves for the

Christmas season may we truly take time to reflect on our relationship with Jesus Christ and with each other!

A word from Bro, Mike

Our world is in desperate need of the message

of Christmas! The message of Christmas is a message of salvation; hope; love; and forgiveness all of which the people of the world need to hear including the 2 million lost people in Alabama!!!

As you think of giving this year I want to encourage you to remember the ministries through the Birmingham Baptist Association. Our churches do a great job in my opinion of supporting SBC causes through our gifts through our Cooperative Program and the two special offerings that are collected each year that also goes to the two mission agencies of the SBC.

Alabama, the leading State Convention in Cooperative Program giving, will give 46.5 % of its annual budget of \$40,500,000.00 to SBC Causes. On top of that we will give an additional \$11, 600,000.00 to the Lottie Moon Christmas offering and \$6,100,000.00 to the Annie Armstrong Easter offering. Praise the Lord!!

The State convention will keep 43.5 % to support Alabama mission enter prizes and 10% will be used to support shared ministries within the state.

The local association does not receive any funding through the Cooperative Program for operating purposes. We only receive what the local churches of our association give. This past year that will total right at \$600,000.00 and our goal is \$625,000.00, and next year we have reduced that amount to \$575,000.00 because it doesn't look like we will reach our goal this year!

We already have to do fundraising events for the first time in our history to find additional operating funds to support the ministries of the BBA! The financial support to the local association is diminishing fast! We will not be able to continue to offer the ministries that we have offered for over 185 years to our churches and to the inner-city ministries we offer on behalf of the churches in the BBA, if we do not turn this situation around! Folks, we are losing our home base!!

This is true of associations all over Alabama and even our State Convention has had to cut its budget a million dollars a year for the last 2 years!

Jesus said begin at Jerusalem and then move out to the uttermost parts. We are going to the utter most parts and neglecting the needs in our own Jerusalem!

My goal as a Director of Missions is to first focus on the needs of our churches; our city; our beloved state and grow healthy churches and keep the home base strong as a launching pad for overseas mission opportunities.

I pray that many of you will join with me in seeking to reach the 2 million lost and unchurched people in Alabama, many of whom live here in Birmingham, as we also reach out to the world with the Gospel of Jesus Christ! We must maintain a healthy balance in our support at all levels of our work which in my opinion we are not doing!

We would be short sighted to keep all of our resources at home, but it is just as shortsighted to send it everywhere in the world and then lose our strong home base which has always been the "launching pad" of support for all that we do in the world.

As we begin a new year next month, I pray that it will be the best year ever for our Association, our State Convention, and our mission work around the world!

All my dreams had come true! However, a truly valuable lesson my parents taught me was to give. Every Christmas Eve we departed from our house with a trunk load of presents and Christmas goodies. We would go from house to house to share our love and celebrate the season. Later in the evening on Christmas Eve we visited a couple of houses to assist Santa in his deliveries. At the Birmingham Baptist Association during Christmas we celebrate "Season of our Savior". Stockings and cakes are collected on December 10th and the area shelters and agencies pick them up on December 12th. These shelters house women and children and the stockings are left for the children on Christmas Eve. Ladies from Alabama Teen Challenge volunteer to help sort and complete order request. Cakes are frozen and used during the days of Christmas at the shelters. Meals on Wheels cuts the cakes and serves them the week of Christmas. Their clients are thrilled to get a special piece of Christmas cake.

Some of the local men's shelters receive some of the stockings as well. The men give a stocking to their children or grandchildren. This might seem like a small thing, but it builds

There were no cakes left and they were disappointed. It seems a family of five had just checked into their transitional housing. That day a young lady in that particular family turned 15 and there would be no birthday celebration for her. Suddenly, God brought to my re-

membrance the whipped cream topping cake with strawberries that had to be refrigerated. Everyone had totally forgotten about it, but God had plans for that special cake!

So, what does it take to make a child smile? It takes genuine love from the heart. Love could be demonstrated in a toy or just a hug. This Christmas season remember the joy of Christmas and the wonderful gift of God's son, Jesus. Bring a smile to a child's face and it will bring a smile to your heart.

Of course, the real heroes are those 54 Loving Touch ministers who make the visits month after month.

A favorite scripture for this ministry is Galatians 6:9 which says, "Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

Loving Touch Ministry wants to let everyone know how the Lord has shone His faithfulness to them by allowing and enabling

them to complete 41 years of ministry.
