A word from our Executive Director

A look ahead to the holidays

Well, praise the Lord the beautiful fall and winter months are ahead of us! I love

the fall of the year and am looking forward to a beautiful October and November! As we look at this quarter's opportunities for service, let me mention some ministry highlights.



First, we just celebrated our annual "Gathering" on Sunday evening, October 2nd, at First Baptist Church of Trussville! It was a great worship and celebration experience for those that attended. I was personally blessed, and from your comments, many of you were too! The staff and good folks at FBC Trussville did a great job in hosting this year's gathering! Thank you Pastor Buddy, Joe Estes, choir, orchestra, and your leadership team for your support in getting ready for the evening celebration. You did a great job! Allison Speer did a great job in honoring the Lord with her testimony and her songs from the heart! The Lord blessed and we are grateful!

Secondly, we are getting ready to send backpacks to the Mississippi River Ministry in support of our State WMU mission project. We are the distribution center for District 11. We will be gathering the backpacks that our churches have prepared and will put them on a truck to be sent to the Delta. We will accept these backpacks on Monday, October 31st thru Thursday, November 3rd from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. each day. Let me remind you that the backpacks are to be already boxed up by the church, taped and labeled, and then brought to the BBA building at 750 Montclair Road, Birmingham, AL 35213. We will load them in a pod until they are picked up on November 3rd.

Thirdly, our annual State Convention meeting will be held this year in Montgomery at Eastmont Baptist Church on November 15-16th. The Pastors Conference will meet on Monday, November 14th, at Eastmont Baptist Church. All of you are encouraged to attend our State Convention.

Fourthly, the "I CARED ENOUGH" Thanksgiving Evangelism Service and Community Thanksgiving Dinner will be held at the CROSSPLEX on Tuesday, November 22nd, which is an all-day event. BBA partners with Daniel Cason Ministries to host this event in the western area of our city. Anyone can volunteer to help any time during the day. We need volunteers to help serve food, hand out clothes, etc. You can also volunteer to help counsel those who make decisions for Christ during the two evangelistic services. This event has taken the place of the "Food for Friends" ministry that we did for years under the Downtown viaduct.

Fifthly, we will be involved again this year with our "Season of Our Savior" ministry which is a ministry where our churches stuff stockings for needy families for Christmas. The churches set a goal for how many stockings they want to stuff and then they plan a meeting at their church to involve their members to buy the items for the stockings and then stuff them. The church then brings the stockings to the BBA building on December 6th-7th from 9:00 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. each day. They will be picked up on December 8th and distributed to the non-profit agencies throughout our city who will then give them to the needy families. This is a great and much needed ministry because this is all of the Christmas some families enjoy.

I hope you will take the time to give of yourself in service through any of these ministries sponsored by the churches of our association. God bless you all!

MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT - Liberty Park Baptist Church Volunteers Minister at Medical Apartments

Liberty Park Baptist Church shares a touching testimony

s we do on the second Tuesday Aof every other month, a group of Liberty Park Baptist church members prepared a delicious meal for folks who live in the UAB Townhouse Apartments, working with this ministry led and sponsored by our Birmingham Baptist Association. A small group of five of us went to the apartments with the food. The people are living there while they or a loved one is in the hospital or is an out-patient with frequent therapies and treatments. The apartments are adjacent to the hospital, so it is super convenient for patients and their families.

One of the requirements of the Townhouse is that the patient must live at least 60 miles away from Birmingham. That has given us the opportunities to meet people from all over Alabama and our surround-

ing states, plus more distant states such as Pennsylvania, Oregon, California, etc. Over the years we often meet a family only one time, and their stories always touch our hearts. Some patients have been in

the hospital for months and months. Some of us exchange Christmas cards.

Last night, after everyone had their plates and had begun to eat I stood up and, after we asked the Lord to bless the food and the people, explained who we were. We usually go around the room and ask each person to give their name and home town, tell their story, and tell us how we can best pray for them. Sometimes we hear only a few words, but oftentimes it is an extended outpouring of someone's heart. That's okay. We don't have a schedule or even a plan. Always we are undeservingly thanked for the food, but also for just listening and for praying. As we were going through that process last night, a group of three people walked in and began to serve themselves a supper in "to go" boxes. Many times a family member will prepare a plate for someone who is too sick to come downstairs where we are, or requires isolation for germ protection. We're used to that. However, this

trio didn't leave, but rather moved and stood along the wall and listened to what everyone was saying. We finally completed our loop around the room, so I asked them if they had a prayer request. One of the ladies introduced herself as Katrina and she began to speak.

"My husband and I are from Crestview, Florida, and we've been here for nearly three years" she stated. "Over those years I have come into this very room where churches come to bring meals, sometimes conduct a Bible study, or just be our friends. This room is usually filled with love. That's why I'm here tonight." She continued on, "my husband had to have a kidney transplant when we first came here nearly three years ago and he has had a very difficult time with his recovery. In fact, he never completely healed. Then, a while back he developed heart and breath-

> ing problems. Long story short, he ended up on the heart-lung transplant waiting list. It has been a long and difficult struggle for us."

> "Three days ago he had a massive stroke and was placed on life

support. This afternoon I crawled up into the bed with him and held him as the doctors removed the life support from him. My sweet husband, only forty-nine years old, died in my arms just a few minutes ago. We, my two friends and I, walked back to the apartments, and all the while I was praying that a church would be in this room tonight. Here you are, and here I am."

I'm reminded that sometimes ministry can seem too repetitive, even boring, so hohum. The desire is to go and try something new and exciting. Personally, I'm so very happy and thankful for this firmly entrenched ministry in the UAB Townhomes and that God allows us to participate. I tell my Sunday School class that I receive more from preparing for a Sunday lesson than I could ever so feebly impart to them. The same is true for the UAB Townhouse ministry. Thank you, Lord, for this opportunity!


