The Leavell College of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary offers *fully accredited certificate courses* at the NOBTS Center for Church Leadership and Development at South Roebuck Baptist Church. The certificate courses are *designed to advance the leadership skills of individuals through formal coursework that trains and develops existing and potential leaders in the local churches of the Birmingham Baptist Association.*

The certificate courses provide *affordable, accredited training and are available to all persons regardless of educational or denominational background.*

The purpose of the center is to address the needs of three audiences:

- Pastors called into ministry, who possess little formal theological training, and are in need of theological education.
- Individual members of local congregations who desire formal education to advance their skills and equip them for ministry.
- Potential church planters.

The Winter term class schedule is as follows:

Classes for the Winter semester of 2014 will meet on Tuesday evenings beginning in January. The Winter term will run for 8 weeks, January 7—February 15, 2014.

Baptist Doctrine—1 credit hour

Tuesday—8:00 pm—10:00 pm
Developing Leaders in the Church—1 credit hour

Classes for the Spring semester of 2014 will meet on Tuesday evenings beginning in March. The Spring term will run for 8 weeks, March 11—April 29, 2014.

The Spring term class schedule is as follows:

Tuesday— 6:00pm—8:00pm
Introduction to Christian Education—1 credit hour

Tuesday—8:00 pm—10:00 pm
Evangelism—1 credit hour

Transfer Credit

A maximum of 12 hours of course credit may be transferred to the Associate degree program and a maximum of 18 hours of course credit may be transferred into the Bachelor's degree program of Leavell College.

Other courses will be added whenever the need arises.

Originally named "Baptist Bible Institute," it was the first theological institution to be created by direct action of the Southern Baptist Convention.

The mission of New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary is to equip servant leaders to fulfill the Great Commission and the Great Commandments through the local church and its ministries.

Leavell College is the undergraduate program of the New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary, which is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools to award associate's, bachelor's, masters, and doctoral degrees.

The graduate programs of NOBTS are also accredited by the Association of Theological Schools of the United States and Canada.
