# To the Parish of Casablanca, EEAM

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Morocco,

Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Hearing kind words from your congregation brings us great joy. Knowing that you pray for us provides comfort. Understanding your commitment to the ministry of the Gospel emboldens us to do likewise.

As you know, in Kentucky we recently experienced a significant winter storm. Snow and ice were piled up in our yards, on our roofs, and on roadways. Ponds were frozen for more than a week. It was cold, blistering cold. For a brief time, life was inconvenient. A month has since passed. The days are getting longer and warmer. Beautiful colors are beginning to emerge as the sun sends down its lovely rays on plants preparing to blossom. Springtime is here. Easter is upon us. The tomb is empty, and Jesus is alive.

Like you, we have been struggling to overcome the Covid-19 Pandemic. Fortunately, many in our congregation have already been vaccinated, and others are scheduled to receive their vaccine.
