



Journey is an appropriate metaphor for the Christian life. Traveling through the wilderness or desert can be lonely and painful. Approaching a fork in the road demonstrates that there are choices to be made. We often meet other travelers who are trying to find their way much like we are. There is beauty around us: rippling waters, chirping birds, and vibrant landscapes. Each experience is different, yet eerily familiar.

I have been on a journey with you for the past 3 years. We have gotten to know each other pretty well. We have laughed and cried together. We have made new friends together and said goodbye to some we cherish. It is no surprise that our journey has brought its ups and downs and twists and turns along the way. The road we travel together

took a sharp turn last spring. A deadly virus upended our path, quite literally! Experts told us that if we would just hunker down for a few months, things would get better. 
