In the second half of life, we begin to learn that the differences in groups and people are not all that important. God starts to lead us to accept and include others in radical ways that we haven't before. Given the current social unrest, I think it's good that our class is studying how, in the second half of life, we can learn to embrace Jesus' vision of welcoming all people to the banquet table of the Kingdom.
