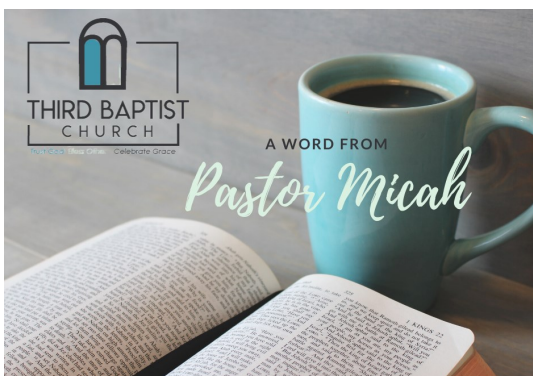

We face trials in life. It is part of the being human. The Bible recounts the lives of people who experience war, plague, famine, and other disasters that would prove nearly impossible to overcome. In fact, the story of God's people chronicles their escape from the bonds of slavery in Egypt only to be met with ongoing obstacles when entering and living in the land of promise. Nowhere in the scriptures do we learn that sincere and strong faith will rid us of difficult circumstances. Instead, we learn of a God so deeply connected with people that he dwells among us in our most challenging days.

We, no doubt, face a time of uncertainty. The path forward is not clear. The future is still unpredictable. Legitimate questions of health and economic security cause stress and anxiety. For now, our congregation will not be meeting in our sanctuary and our building will remain closed for all events. In early June we will reassess the situation. Personally, I do not view Covid-19 as some sort of divine judgment or test of faith. Instead, I am choosing to view the current crisis in light of the biblical narrative. As people of faith we are confronted with an extraordinary challenge, not unlike the challenges confronting our faith heroes – Moses, Deborah, David, Daniel, and Esther. Our God took them by the hand and walked with them through the storms they faced, and I sense that God is doing the same for us.
