

CBF Kentucky is highlighting some of the unique ministries taking place throughout our fellowship. They recently asked me to write an article highlighting our children's and youth ministries at Third Baptist. This is what I shared with our friends around the state:

Each Wednesday afternoon just before 3 p.m. I lace up my sneakers, roll up my sleeves, and drive to Third Baptist Church in Owensboro. As I pull into the church parking lot, I notice the first van unloads exuberant children and teenagers. While this first group of students begins working on homework

and playing games, the van drivers make multiple runs transporting more student to Third Baptist. At 5 p.m. our friendly volunteer kitchen staff serve supper. Previously, pizza was served each Wednesday; however, recently the Owensboro School system began providing the food. (the kids prefer pizza!)

Following supper, elementary school students attend classes in Bible and music. Middle and high school students choose whether to volunteer in the church's clothes closet or attend a peer-led support group. Then, they attend Bible

study with the adult class. At 7 p.m. the first group of students load vans to return home with the van drivers making multiple runs. At approximately 9 p.m. all students finally arrive at their destinations.

Our church volunteers host more than 100 students each week. While most of the students' parents are not engaged in the life our church, these students continue to return week after week! These students have unlimited potential, which is reinforced by the caring, loving kindness and support that the volunteers are so willing to give. Like all of us, these students love to be loved. Moreover, we have been granted the opportunity to transform our community one child at a time as we fulfill our mission: Trust God, Bless Others, and Celebrate Grace.
