


Special Guest Speaker on August 30th

Megan is the 28-year old author of *Miracle on Voodoo Mountain*, the true story that compelled her to move to Haiti after dreaming about a tree she had seen there on a short-term business/mission trip following the 2010 earthquake. Four years later, Megan founded Respire Haiti, a Christian organization that includes a school for 500 children, a medical clinic and has plans to build a church, community center and library.

Children's Ministry

It's a new Beginning – new school year, new after-school activities and new Sunday School Classes. While parents are preparing supply lists and school clothes, we in the Children's Ministry are busy getting ready as well. Promotion Sunday is August 9 and all our children will move up to their next age group or grade in Sunday School.

If your child will be in our 3 or 4 yr. old Preschool classes this Fall, he or she will begin their morning in their new small group classroom when you drop them off at 9:30am. Children must be 3 years old by August 15, 2015 and potty-trained in order to move to the 3 year old class. 3 year olds meet in room CW163 and 4 yr. olds meet in room CW166. They will attend large group assembly time in Room CW160 at 10:00am with Ms. Becki and Ms. Damaris. Preschoolers will remain in the large group assembly room CW160 for pick up by parents at 10:30. They may also stay in the assembly room for Children's Praise & Worship during the 10:45 Contemporary and 11:00 Traditional Worship services.

If your child will be attending Kindergarten this Fall, he or she will begin attending Sunday School upstairs with all the elementary age children. On August 9 we invite you to participate in our Kindergarten Promotion Parade. You should arrive at 9:15am in the preschool assembly room, CW160. Parents and children will be processing together up to the Elementary Assembly Room and parents are invited to stay and attend small group this week as this could help to alleviate any "first day jitters". Beginning August 16 Kindergartners will begin their morning in the Elementary Large Group Assembly Room, CW 224 at 9:30am. Pick up will be in your child's Small Group Room which will be downstairs in Room CW 182.

If your child has been attending Elementary Sunday School, he or she will continue to gather in our Large Group Assembly Room CW224 at 9:30 am for Praise & Worship with Ms Becki and Ms Damaris. They will finish their Sunday School time in small group rooms with their Small Group Shepherds where parents may pick them up at 10:30 am.



Sell: Over 300 consignors tag children's items to sell in our sale. They receive 70% of their earnings (more if they volunteer), and the remaining benefits the children's ministries at HFUMC.

Shop: Area parents shop our sale for clothes, toys, books and more for their children. Volunteers get to shop early at our popular presale.

Give: This is what makes our sale different than other area sales. We give in three ways:

- 1. Volunteers give their time. Our sale is 100% run by volunteers and it could not happen without them.
- 2. The children's department gives 10% of the proceeds back to the church's general fund as tithe.
- 3. We encourage consignors to donate items that do not sell to various local charities, including Samaritan Center, Cumberland Crisis Pregnancy Center, and 61st Ave UMC.
