Hasan Davis, a lawyer, juvenile criminal justice reform advocate, author and actor, will speak to the Maryville College community on Monday, January 21, 2019 during the College's Martin Luther King Jr. holiday observances.

Davis will speak at 11 a.m. in the Clayton Center for the Arts' Harold and Jean Lambert Recital Hall.

FROM THE INTERIM ASSOCIATE PASTOR

2018 will go down for me as a year where life most times was great, and I admit at times, not so great (that's why it is called life, right?). In my family I started losing cousins of my generation, family members' illnesses appeared to linger on and on even with prayer, and while we as Christians may live separate from the world we are also connected to the things of the world - good and bad. All of our spirits have been shaken by mass shootings, unimaginable separation of children from their parents, and literally for some in our society their lives seem less important than others. At the same time, I felt the goodness of God – being passed on from friends and neighbors (and even strangers), peacemakers abounding in creating peace and God's presence forever near.

The question for me is - Lord, what would you have me do in this time and place? How do I take a stand? Do I pray? Do I send a check? I believe we all have such questions. Last week Michelle Huntoon, chair of the Church in the World Ministry Team shared an article that was written by Emily Brewer, who was birth into the ministry as God would have it from this church. She was arrested along with 30 clergy members on the border as they sought to support those who seek asylum in our country. She was led to take a stand and for me her fearlessness, concern and empathy are admirable.

As we move into 2019, two thoughts are inspirational for me, one from the scripture and the other from the movie "Coach Carter."

In the Scripture, Mordecai reminds Esther (and us) in Esther 4:13-14 that just because we find ourselves in special places it does not mean that we will escape what could happen to others and that while we live in a specific place and time we can make a difference.

...he sent back this answer: "Do not think that because you are in the king's house you alone of all the Jews will escape. For if you remain silent at this time, relief and deliverance for the Jews will arise from another place, but you and your father's family will perish. And

who knows but that you have come to your royal position for such a time as this?"

The second is a quote from the movie "Coach Carter." He makes a strong attempt to motivate his basketball team to do their best. Like the team, sometime we feel ineffective and afraid so we step back from giving our best. The coach encourages and challenges our understanding of giving our best to a situation. He indicates that doing our best is liberating. And as we are liberated, those in our presence are liberated as well... this is profound.

Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate. Our deepest fear is that we are powerful beyond measure. It is our light, not our darkness, that most frightens us. Your playing small does not serve the world. There is nothing enlightened about shrinking so that other people won't feel insecure around you. We are all meant to shine as children do. It's not just in some of us; it is in everyone. And as we let our own lights shine, we unconsciously give other people permission to do the same. As we are liberated from our own fear, our presence automatically liberates others.

My invitation... as life takes us to special times and places in 2019, let us with a fearlessness and boldness join God's plan in deliverance, liberation and light-shining.
