FROM THE PASTOR

"I love it when a plan comes together." If you're old enough, you may remember those words coming from Hannibal Smith, the cigarchomping leader of the A-Team, played by actor George Peppard.

George Peppard and I shared a birthday, but that's where our similarities end.

Except that I, too, love it when a plan comes together. And the staffing plan that came out of our visioning work last fall is coming together.

The Associate Pastor Nominating Committee (APNC) is the group you elected last August to guide us through the process of searching for and calling (now) two associate pastors: an Associate Pastor for Church Life and Family Ministries, and an Associate Pastor for Emerging Generations and Mission.

Thanks to the congregation's unanimous support of the staffing design at a January 6 congregational meeting, the APNC was able to write both Ministry Information Forms (MIFs) and secure appropriate approvals from the Session and the Presbytery of East Tennessee's Committee on Ministry last month.

They have done some very good work very quickly, and as of January 24th, our two MIFs have been posted to the Church Leadership Connection (think of it as the Presbyterian version of the eHarmony online dating site). Those MIFs will be matched with Personal Information Forms (PIFs) from candidates who gifts might meet our needs. We anticipate that they will receive several hundred PIFs, which will all be read, rated and discussed.

This positions us perfectly to be able to be in conversation with students graduating from seminary in May of this year, and we continue to hope that we might have both positions filled by the time school starts. Nevertheless, both the APNC and the Session agree that we want the right people, regardless of the time frame. I hope you will join me in praying for this process:

- Pray for wisdom and discernment for the APNC
- Pray for our future Associate Pastors, that they will read our MIFs and be intrigued at the possibilities.
- Pray for our current staff, as they

- Pray for good intuition on the part of both those searching and those being sought
- Finally, pray for us as a congregation. We have said that we want to be changed. Pray that God will give us the courage to do that.

Next up, while the APNC continues their work, will be for us as a congregation to consider how we will implement our vision for our life together. While staff may help a congregation pursue goals and develop programs, at the end of the day, this is your church, and so it needs to reflect your understanding what God is asking us to do.

The APNC will be providing periodic updates on their progress. I know they would also welcome your input and thoughts as we move forward. Again, those people are: Dan Young (chair), Jimmy Beard, Jordis Blackburn, Jason Brooks, Arielle Kilday, Dianne Lashmit, Karen Paxton and Denise Vogado. Please feel free to contact any of them with your lots, and please give them each a pat on the back for the good and faithful work they are doing. They need our love and support!

The Session met on January 22, 2019 and approved or discussed the following:

Session approved the following:

- Approved the Ministry Information Forms (MIFs) for submission to the Church Leadership Connection database.
- Approval for Children's Committee to move forward on confirming details for an Intermediate Retreat (4th & 5th grades) to visit the Muse Plantation in Knoxville and have lunch together. They will attend a specific program related to Astronomy which dovetails nicely with our current Harry Potter curriculum for that age group. A majority of the cost will be covered by an existing line item in the children's budget. The date of the event will be March 3.

- CITW requests approval of a \$100 donation for the NAACP Freedom Fund Scholarship. It is proposed this is taken from line 50500 CITW Wish List which has \$680 remaining for distribution this fiscal year. The donation to the scholarship fund is recommended in lieu of a request to purchase a table at the first annual Alcoa/Blount County NAACP Freedom Fund Gala scheduled for February 28 at the Airport Hilton. This event would have cost \$500 for a table for 10, with approximately 50% of that cost supporting the scholarship fund.
- Congregational Life wishes to establish a knitting group that would meet twice monthly from 6:30-8:00 p.m. and would be for anyone to join. A possible meeting time would be the second and fourth Mondays of each month. Items knitted, such as caps, lap blankets, or prayer shawls, could be donated to charity. Congregational Life unanimously approved the establishment of a knitting group at the church.
- Approved request to waive the facilities use fee for an event planned on March 2. Audrey Blackburn is planning to host a luncheon to address hunger in our community as a component to earn her Girl Scouts Gold Award. Audrey will be selling tickets or requesting contributions, with proceeds donated to support hunger relief in the community. She is also making hand made bowls for all ticket holders or contributors. Audrey would like to offer tickets to event on February 17 and February 24. Motion was approved.

SEVEN SPIRITUAL PRACTICES

Cultivating our faith life is an important part of wellness. Here are a few ways to gain a new perspective of yourself, others, and God throughout the year.
