I'm sure you've had this experience: you read or hear something that immediately lodges in your memory -

so much so that you will never forget it. That happened with me with this little prayer from Lois Cheney in a book called God Is No Fool. I can't remember when I first read it, but it's

been a long, long time. I was surprised to learn that the book was first published almost 50 years ago.

Every page is worth savoring, but this one poem captured my attention, and has never let go:

People important to you, people unimportant to you, cross your life, touch it with love and carelessness, and move on. There are people that leave you, and you breathe a sigh of relief, and you wonder why you ever came in contact with them. There are people who leave, and you breathe a sigh of remorse, and wonder why they had to go and leave such a gaping hole.

Children leave parents, friends leave friends, acquaintances move on. You think on the many who have moved into your life with hazy memory. You look on those present and wonder.

I believe in God's master plan for our

People move in and out of each other's lives, and each leaves a mark on the other. You find you are made up of bits and pieces of all who have touched your life, and you are more because of it, and you would be less without them.

Pray God that you can accept the bits and pieces in humility and wonder, and never question, and never regret.

Those words resonate with me again as we prepare to bid farewell to Steve Musick after his 16 years of service as our Associate Pastor. As you know, on November 11, Steve will preach a final sermon, and then we will celebrate his ministry among us with a reception in Westminster Hall following the second worship service. It will be a bittersweet

day - hard for us to say goodbye to Steve and Lynne, but a joyous celebration as we wish them well in Steve's retirement.

> As you may know, Lynne has been (mostly) based out of Nashville for several years development director for the S&ME engineering firm. So Steve's retirement provides a

welcome opportunity for them to be in the same house in the same city for more than just a weekend again.

But it is still a loss on our part. Lynne and Steve have every intention of returning to Maryville again, but in order to smooth the transition of the next pastor coming to New Providence, the presbytery asks Steve to stay away until the next installed associate has been in place for at least a year. That means that Steve will be saying "no" to requests for funerals, baptisms, weddings and pastoral care - not because he does not love this congregation and its members, but because he wants to insure that his successor has the same kind of vital and thriving ministry that he has had.

Steve and I have enjoyed many, many years as colleagues and friends. We often tell people that we're more like siblings than anything - we can challenge one another and push each other and say hard things when they're called for. But at the end of the day, Steve knows I have his back, and I know he has mine. I will miss his friendship and counsel, not to mention losing a fellow Texan right next door.

I hope you will join me as we offer our thanks and best wishes to the Musicks in this next season of their life together. I look forward to seeing you on November 11th!

HEALTH TIPS

HEALTHY THOUGHTS: HOW TO IMPROVE YOUR DAY IN FIVE MINUTES

"Yet you do not know what tomorrow will bring. What is your life? For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." (James

Five minutes...it's only a little bit of time. But it's long enough for you to do at least one thing that could make your whole day better. So take five minutes and try one of these 9 simple ways to lower stress, boost your mood, and get more energy. It might give you that extra spark you need to meet the challenges of the day.

- Pray/Meditate. Find a comfortable place in your home. At times, distracting thoughts pop up in your mind, but just let them float by and turn your attention back to your breath or prayer. Praying/ meditating daily, even just for a few minutes, will strengthen your spirit.
- Make your bed. It's a small ritual that can help create a calm environment for you in your bedroom-and a soothing bedroom is part of "sleep hygiene"habits that can help you sleep better. Author Gretchen Rubin recommends making this a daily habit in her book, The Happiness Project. Do it first thing in the morning, and you've got one less thing to worry about for the rest of the day.

- Pack a snack. Before you head out the door in the morning, prep a healthy snack to take with you. Ideas include fruit, unsalted nuts. and low-fat cheese or yogurt. When you get hungry later in the afternoon, you'll be ready!
- Clear your space. From stray papers to scattered coffee mugs, clutter can make you lose focus and feel unproductive. As you declutter your environment, you will feel more focused in your day.
- Turn on the tunes. Several studies have found that listening to music can help lower blood pressure, reduce stress, and boost mood. Put on a record or CD that will make you smile whether you're relaxing or working on a task.
- Sniff a lemon. For a quick destressing trick, turn to your sense of smell. Japanese researchers found that linalool, a substance found in lemons, may reduce the "flight-or-fight" stress response. Not into lemons? Try basil, juniper, or lavender-those scents have also been found to lower stress.
- Stretch. No need to put on your yoga pants or get too bendy. Just a few easy moves will do. Be gentle, so you don't overdo it. Stretching can help improve your circulation and flexibility, and may help ease the tight muscles that come with
- Keep a gratitude diary. Take a minute every day to write down what you're thankful for-big or small. It's easy to vent about weather, traffic, or health woes, but complaining brings negative energy along with it. Being thankful for what you have can make you appreciate the positives in your life.
- Turn off your electronics. Take a little break from your gadgets. Staring at computer screens and electronics all day long can zap your energy and encourage inactivity.
