First Baptist Church - History

1903—1909

July, 1903 - A tent was erected on the Noll lots, a block northeast of the first church building.
July 19, 1903 - A call was made for all Baptist people to assemble in the tent for the purpose of organizing a Baptist Church. Twenty-nine desired to be members. The church became known as First Baptist Church of Bethany, Missouri. The I.O.O.F. hall off the southeast corner of the square was the home of the church for five years.
1906 - A campaign was launched to build a new church building.
April 12, 1908 - Dedication of the new brick building a block off the northeast corner of the square was held.
1909 - Bro. H. P. Kelly of Stanberry was called as pastor.

1910—1919

1913 - After Bro. Kelly's resignation, and with the church being in a weakened condition, it was decided to discontinue Sunday school. But Mrs. George Arney and Bertha Wagoner refused to give up. The next Sunday, four girls responded to the ringing bell, and attendance slowly began to grow.
Nov. 1913 - Bro. A. K. Williams became pastor.
1913-1919 - The church had three other pastors. The church was having half time preaching and the membership dropped.

1920—1929

1920 - Rev. W. O. Dotson was called as pastor.
1923 - Feeling the church needed a full time pastor on the field, Bro. Dotson resigned because of his wife's health and the impossibility of him moving to town.
Dec. 2, 1923 - Rev. Benton Atteberry, a native of Bethany and a charter member of the church, was called as pastor.
1927 - Mrs. Mary Selby passed away, bequeathing \$1,000.00 to the church to be invested and the interest to be used each year as her pledge for the pastor's salary.

1930—1939

1931 - The church was beginning to outgrow its accommodations.
1932 - Church membership was 191.
1933 - First Vacation Bible School was held.
1938 - Church membership was 363 and Sunday School enrollment was 228.
Sept. 1938 - Bro. Carl McIntire came on the field. Bro. Mac felt God had called him to Bethany for the purpose of relieving the housing problem. A structure of two floors and a basement were built in the alleyway south of the church.
Jan. 8, 1939 - We moved into our new quarters and everyone was in the church building worshiping together again.
Dec. 31, 1939 - Bro. Mac, having a malignant throat problem preached his last sermon and passed away six weeks later.

1940—1949

Oct. 1940 - Revival meeting saw 35 additions (25 by baptism). The following spring, revival brought 33 more additions.
1943 - Purchased our first parsonage on S. 22nd Street.
1946 - \$1,500.00 was taken from the general fund and put in a building fund.
1948 - Voted to give a percentage of our offerings to missions.

1950—1959

1954 - Adopted the Articles of Agreement of Incorporation.
1955 - Rented an apartment across the street to house the ever growing Junior Sunday School Department. Sunday school attendance averaged 235.
1957 - Purchased a 150 x 300 foot lot for \$12,000.00, with money left to start another building fund account.
1959 - Started the Tenth Street Mission Church.

1960—1969

Feb. 1961 - Entered into a contract with Sutton Construction to erect a new building.
June 4, 1961 - Held our Cornerstone Laying Ceremony.
Oct. 29, 1961 - Held our first service in our new building.
Nov. 26, 1961 - Dedication Service held.
Jan. 1963 - Hired janitors to clean the church.
1963 - Sunday school attendance averaging over 250.
1966 - Hired our first secretary.
1968 - Installed air conditioning.

1970—1979

1971 - Did our first church directory.
Oct. 1971 - Purchased a different parsonage on Vandiver Street.
Oct. 31, 1971 - Held a Note Burning Ceremony of paying off the church debt.
1973 - Purchased two busses and began a Bus Ministry and Children's Church.
Aug. 1974 - Called our first Assistant to the Pastor.
1976 - Average Sunday school attendance was 238, average Worship attendance was 273, and bus attendance was 62.
Oct. 29, 1978 - Began Radio Broadcast on KAAN.

1980—1989

1982 - Average Sunday school attendance was 180, and average Worship attendance was 221.
Mar. 1983 - Purchased new lights for the sanctuary.
Nov. 1983 - Gave \$50.00 per month toward the salary of a pastor ministering in Southeast Iowa Southern Baptist Association.
1985 - Received a new sound system as a memorial for Clarence Clarke.
Jan. 1986 - Remodeled the sanctuary, completed the balcony, installed new windows and new carpet.
Sept. 12-14, 1986 - Held a Lay Renewal Weekend.
Dec. 1986 - Gave Lincoln St. Baptist Church in Mt. Pleasant, Iowa, \$2,761.31, which was the tithe we had voted to give on the remodeling.

1990—1999

Nov. 1990 - Purchased new hymnals.
Apr. 1991 - Put a new roof on the sanctuary.
Dec. 1991 - Paid \$50.00 per month to First Baptist Church, Blythedale, MO for their pastor's support.
Feb. 1993 - Participated in the MBC church link-up partnership with a church in Belarus, taking a love offering for them each November until 2002 when the partnership ended.
May 1993 - Established a Long Range Planning Committee.
Aug. 1993 - Updated our membership roll.
Aug. 1996 - Became a part of the Harrison Baptist Association.
Oct. 1996 - Gave away the house on the property north of the church, which we had purchased, and made a parking lot there.
1997 - Average Sunday school attendance was 189, average Worship attendance was 213, and VBS enrollment was 192.


2000 to Present

Jan. 2000 - Voted to hire an architect for a new addition.
July, 2000 - Purchased a house in Oakland Ave. and the youth are using it for Sunday school and their Wednesday night program.
Nov. 2000 - Approved the proposed building plans.
June 3, 2001 - Held a kick-off banquet and contribution commitment for our new addition. \$338,585.00 was pledged for the building fund.
2001 - Average Sunday school attendance was 182, average Worship attendance was 211 and VBS enrollment was 208.
Mar. 17, 2002 - Held our Ground Breaking Service.
June, 2002 - Volunteer groups, "Builders for Christ" and "Workers for Christ" each spent a week working on framing in and putting the roof on the new building. Church people have since worked one night each week on finishing the building.
Dec. 2002 - We are still debt free on our building addition.
Jan. 2003 - We are doing our seventh church directory, which will be our Centennial Directory.
July 19, 20, 2003 - We are planning our 100th anniversary and the dedication of our new addition, "Celebrating a Century of God's Faithfulness" to us. TO GOD BE THE GLORY!




