The content of this letter follows very closely that of 2 Peter. It shows how 2 Peter was fulfilled. Many date this letter after 2 Peter, sometime between A.D. 75 and 80.

Verse 1: "Jude" was a half-brother of Jesus our Lord (Matthew 13:55, Mark 6:3; Acts 1:14, 1 Corinthians 9:5). He was also a brother of James, the leader of the church in Jerusalem.
