
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

MINISTER: In the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit. **CONGREGATION:** Amen.

- M: In the beginning, God created a perfect world. He created perfect people and provided them all that they needed for their bodies and lives.
- C: God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.
- M: So that they might worship him, God gave Adam and Eve the command to avoid eating the fruit of one special tree.
- C: You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die.
- M: Tempted by Satan, Adam and Eve ate from this tree. The perfect creation was ruined. Their relationship with God was devastated.
- C: Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the Lord God among the trees of the garden.
- M: But God gave to Adam and Eve the promise of a Savior, one who would set right forever what they had done wrong.
- C: So the Lord God said to the serpent, "...I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."
- M: All of Adam and Eve's natural descendants, including each of us, have been conceived and born in sin in the image of our sinful parents.
- C: Sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned.
- M: We confess our sinful condition and our sins of thought, word, and deed:
- C: Holy and merciful Lord, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. I have disobeyed you in many ways by doing what you forbid and by failing to do what you command. Have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: As God promised first to Adam and Eve, he sent his own beloved Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Jesus lived a perfect life for us and died an innocent death to save us. Having heard your confession, I as God's called servant forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him.


PRAYER OF THE DAY

FIRST LESSON Genesis 25:21-34

Isaac prayed to the LORD on behalf of his wife, because she was barren. The LORD answered his prayer, and his wife Rebekah became pregnant. The babies jostled each other within her, and she said, "Why is this happening to me?" So she went to inquire of the LORD. The LORD said to her, "Two nations are in your womb, and two peoples from within you will be separated; one people will be stronger than the other, and the older will serve the younger." When the time came for her to give birth, there were twin boys in her womb. The first to come out was red, and his whole body was like a hairy garment; so they named him Esau. After this, his brother came out, with his hand grasping Esau's heel; so he was named Jacob. Isaac was sixty years old when Rebekah gave birth to them. The boys grew up, and Esau became a skillful hunter, a man of the open country, while Jacob was a quiet man, staying among the tents. Isaac, who had a taste for wild game, loved Esau, but Rebekah loved Jacob. Once when Jacob was cooking some stew, Esau came in from the open country, famished. He said to Jacob, "Quick, let me have some of that red stew! I'm famished!" (That is why he was also called Edom.) Jacob replied, "First sell me your birthright." "Look, I am about to die," Esau said. "What good is the birthright to me?" But Jacob said, "Swear to me first." So he swore an oath to him, selling his birthright to Jacob. Then Jacob gave Esau some bread and some lentil stew. He ate and drank, and then got up and left. So Esau despised his birthright.

The Psalms of the Old Testament Scriptures were sung by God's people and became the first hymnbook of the Early Christian Church.

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness.

Therefore each of you must put off falsehood and speak truthfully to his neighbor, for we are all members of one body. "In your anger do not sin": Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold. He who has been stealing must steal no longer, but must work, doing something useful with his own hands, that he may have something to share with those in need.

Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

Be imitators of God, therefore, as dearly loved children and live a life of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us as a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God.

GOSPEL Matthew 18:15-20



would a pagan or a tax collector.

Do You Use Scrip?

In less than one year, Grace members have purchased almost \$130,000 worth of Scrip gift cards. These purchases have earned about \$6,750 in profits that support our WELS high school in Phoenix, Arizona Lutheran Academy (ALA), and which are also shared to support other ministries. If you are a qualifying Scrip user, watch for your profit report this summer and the opportunity to direct the profits you have earned. You can direct them to ALA, to Grace, or to the tuition account of one of our students at Redeemer Lutheran School or ALA. Scrip profits directed to Grace this year will be used in our "Workers Scholarship Fund." This fund assists in paying tuition for Grace members seeking to become pastors or teachers through our WELS schools. We have several young people that may be pursuing this goal in the next few years.

If you are not currently a Scrip user, please consider becoming one! It doesn't cost any extra money (you get the full value of the cash you pay on the cards that you can use for your everyday shopping), but it helps support Lutheran education. Tuition Tax Credit

Don't forget that as an Arizona tax payer, you can take advantage of the Tuition Tax Credit and support our students at Lutheran Schools. Your donation to the HELP Scholarship Foundation (www.helpscholarships.org) is used to pay tuition for students at our schools, and you can even recommend a specific school or student. Your donation is also eligible for a dollar-for-dollar tax credit up to \$503 per person (\$1006 for a married couple filing jointly) or up to your tax liability if it is lower.

New this year if your tax liability is higher than the tax credit limits, you may be eligible to donate an additional \$500 per person which will be used to support additional students who qualify.
