
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

# Lighting of Advent Candles

The lighting of candles in anticipation of Christ's coming (Latin, advenio) has a long tradition in the Christian Church. On each of the four Sundays of Advent, a new candle is lit, dispelling the darkness, as the church moves forward to welcoming him who is the true Light of the world. The evergreen wreath represents eternal life—evergreens do not drop their foliage—and the circle of the wreath is unending. The blue color of the candles symbolizes hope—the hope we have as we anticipate Christ's coming. The white Christ Candle in the center will be lit on Christmas Day as we celebrate the birth of our Savior. Each year the privilege of lighting the Advent candles is given to the youth confirmation students at Grace.



- **L:** We hear his call to give him a place in our hearts.
- C: We light four Advent candles as a sign of our joy and hope.
- **L:** Come, Lord Jesus, be our guest.
- C: Through your Word and Spirit may our souls be blessed.

#### FIRST LESSON

Adam lay with his wife Eve, and she became pregnant and gave birth to Cain. She said, "With the help of the LORD I have brought forth a man." Later she gave birth to his brother Abel. Now Abel kept flocks, and Cain worked the soil.

Then the LORD said to Cain, "Why are you angry? Why is your face downcast? If you do what is right, will you not be accepted? But if you do not do what is right, sin is crouching at your door; it desires to have you, but you must master it." Now Cain said to his brother Abel, "Let's go out to the field." And while they were in the field, Cain attacked his brother Abel and killed him.

Adam lay with his wife again, and she

Genesis 4:1,2,6-8,25-5:5 (NIV)

gave birth to a son and named him Seth, saying, "God has granted me another child in place of Abel, since Cain killed him." Seth also had a son, and he named him Enosh. At that time men began to call on the name of the LORD. This is the written account of Adam's line. When God created man. he made him in the likeness of God. He created them male and female and blessed them. And when they were created, he called them "man." When Adam had lived 130 years, he had a son in his own likeness, in his own image; and he named him Seth. After Seth was born, Adam lived 800 years and had other sons and daughters. Altogether, Adam lived 930 years, and then he died.

The First Lesson is frequently a reading from the Old Testament. It shares a common theme with the Second Lesson (often from one of the epistles) and the Gospel.

# SECOND LESSON

A great and wondrous sign appeared in heaven: a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet and a crown of twelve stars on her head. She was pregnant and cried out in pain as she was about to give birth. Then another sign appeared in heaven: an enormous red dragon with seven heads and ten horns and seven crowns on his heads. His tail swept a third of the stars out of the sky and flung them to

the earth. The dragon stood in front of the woman who was about to give birth, so that he might devour her child the moment it was born. She gave birth to a son, a male child, who will rule all the nations with an iron scepter. And her child was snatched up to God and to his throne. The woman fled into the desert to a place prepared for her by God, where she might be taken care of for 1,260 days.

# **December Voters' Meeting Actions**

- 1. The 2013 Grace Church Council members were elected in our Voters' Meeting on Tuesday, December 18. *President*: Bryan Guenther, *Vice President*: Robert Parra, *Member Ministry Elder*: Jason Watson, *Outreach Elder*: Jeff Weinstein, *Education Elder*: DJ Miller, *Recording Secretary*: Dallas Johnson, *Trustee*: Dave Breitkreitz, *Financial Secretary*: Doug Lemke, *Treasurer*: Chris Stuhr. We did not have a candidate for Spiritual Needs Elder. In keeping with our constitution, the President will appoint someone to fill that council position.
- 2. The Ministry Spending Plan that was available to all members prior to the meeting was approved with one change. It was voted to not include the Music Coordinator position in our spending plan for 2013 and to instead add that amount (\$7,917) to our Congregational Mission Offering to the synod, bringing that total to \$19,917. The approved MSP for 2013 totals \$514,119.97. All members will receive a copy of the approved MSP in their 2013 Stewardship Packets.

# **Tuition Tax Credit**

Students from Grace at Redeemer Lutheran School and Arizona Lutheran Academy have received over \$24,000 this year in tuition tax credit awards. You can help support Lutheran education and receive a credit on your Arizona state income taxes (up to \$503 per person and up to your income tax liability). Donations made to the HELP Scholarship Foundation before the end of the year will be awarded to students in early spring. Please make use of this program if you are able to do so. If you have any questions, please speak to Stephanie Weinstein (623-3759) or one of the pastors. **Pick up a flyer and a donation form brochure in the Fellowship Hall.** New this year, if you have further tax liability, you may be able to donate an additional \$500 per person to the "Plus" scholarship program and receive a dollar-for-dollar tax credit. Donations to HELP may be recommended for one of the students from Grace.

Grace currently supports 11 of our active members who are students enrolled at Redeemer and 6 at ALA.



# Filling Gaps & Raising Reserves

This is to my Father's glory, that you bear much fruit. -John 15:8

"Filling Gaps & Raising Reserves" is the special, year-end initiative to raise funds to: (1) honor our remaining 2012 congregation mission offering ("CMO") commitment to the Synod of approximately \$25,000, (2) close any spending gap for 2012, and (3) establish a Reserve Fund to be used to pay for future items not

budgeted for in the Ministry & Spending Plan (e.g., new air conditioning unit, major repairs, and seasonal fluctuations in offerings).

"Filling Gaps & Raising Reserves" has <u>two challenge grants</u>. Through December 31, 2012, a group of anonymous members of our congregation will <u>match</u> gifts <u>dollar for dollar</u>, up to \$25,000 -- \$12,500 match for the CMO offerings and \$12,500 match for the Reserve Fund offerings.

To date, the offerings (including the matching funds) total <u>\$12,624</u> for the CMO support and <u>\$7,030</u> for the Reserve Fund. Thank you for your generous offerings. We pray that our congregation will fully take advantage of the two challenge grants.

# "Chrismons" Christ-Monograms

Chrismons are symbols that proclaim Jesus' name and his works of salvation for us. Here are explanations for the Chrismons you see on our Christmas trees.



THE ANCHOR CROSS represents our certain hope of salvation anchored in Christ.



THE BUDDED CROSS with its trefoil ends emphasizes the Trinity.



THE CELTIC CROSS has a circle in the middle symbolizing eternity. Because it has ancient ties to Christians in Ireland, Iona and Scotland, it is also called the Irish or Iona Cross.



THE CROSS WITH ORB symbolizes the world united under Christ, as the Lord cares for heaven and earth.



THE GREEK CROSS has four arms of equal length. Early Greek artists used this cross.



IHS is the acrostic of the first three letters of Jesus' name in Greek (Inσους). Various meanings have been attached to each letter. The horizontal line that forms the cross is the sign for an abbreviation.



THE IOTA CROSS is the first letter of "Jesus" in Greek ( $\mathbf{I}$ =IOTA) combined with the first letter of "Christ" in Greek ( $\mathbf{X}$ =CHI).



THE JERUSALEM CROSS (also known as the CRUSADER'S CROSS) represents the city of peace. The 5 crosses represent the 5 wounds of our Lord. The 4 smaller crosses are also said to represent the spread of the gospel to the 4 corners of the earth.



THE MALTESE CROSS is comprised of 4 arms shaped like spear-heads. Each points to the center, with the broad end having 2 points. The 8 points in all represent the beatitudes (Matt. 5:3-10). This is the emblem of John the Baptist. The cross was the emblem of the Knights of St. John, who were driven from Rhodes to the island of Malta by the Turks. Malta is the island where St. Paul was shipwrecked.



THE ROMAN CROSS consists of the Latin Cross and the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, the alpha ( $\mathbf{A}$ ) and omega ( $\mathbf{\Omega}$ ) symbolizing Jesus as the Eternal One: the 'First and the Last, the Beginning and the End.' Though he died on the cross, he reigns in glory forever.



THE STAR (NATAL) CROSS reminds us of the star that marked our Savior's birth.



THE TAU CROSS, shaped like the Greek letter  $\mathbf{T}$  (tau), depicts the type of cross Moses is believed to have raised in the desert with the serpent on it. It is also the traditional sign that Israelites made with lamb's blood on their doorposts in Egypt on the night of Passover. Therefore this is the cross of penitence and prophecy.



CHALICE AND WAFER represent the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.



THREE INTERLACING CIRCLES represent the three distinct persons of the Holy Trinity, yet just one God.



THE DESCENDING DOVE symbolizes the Holy Spirit, remembering the baptism of Jesus when he descended in the form of a dove.



THE TABLET OF STONE is a symbol of the Ten Commandments given by God to Moses on Mt. Sinai.



THE BUTTERFLY brings to mind our Lord's resurrection from the dead and reminds us that all believers in Christ will also rise to eternal life. The first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, the alpha (A) and omega ( $\Omega$ ) are sometimes added to signify the eternal life enjoyed by those who die in the Lord.



THE CROSS CROWN is a symbol of the Kingship of our Lord, reminding us that he is the King of kings and the Lord of lords. It also reminds us of the crown of life given to believers for their lives of faith.



THE CHI-RHO is a monogram consisting of the first two Greek letters of 'Christ',  ${f X}$  and  ${f P}.$ 



THE FISH is the most ancient symbol of Christ. Christians drew the image of the fish to identify each other in times of persecution. The Greek word for fish is  $IX\Theta\Upsilon\Sigma$  (ichthus). The acrostic represents this meaning:  $I=I_{esus}X=Christ\Theta=God$ 's  $\Upsilon=Son\Sigma=Savior$ .



THE 5-POINTED STAR/EPIPHANY STAR represents the star of Bethlehem and is shaped roughly like a human being representing Christ's incarnation.



THE 6-POINTED STAR/CREATOR'S STAR/STAR OF DAVID symbolizes creation. Each point refers to a day of God's creating work.



THE TREFOIL AND TRIANGLE is a symbol of the Holy Trinity showing both the unity of the Godhead as well as the diversity of the Persons.
