
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

MINISTER: In the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit. **CONGREGATION:** Amen.

- M: In the beginning, God created a perfect world. He created perfect people and provided them all that they needed for their bodies and lives.
- C: God saw all that he had made, and it was very good.
- M: So that they might worship him, God gave Adam and Eve the command to avoid eating the fruit of one special tree.
- C: You are free to eat from any tree in the garden; but you must not eat from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, for when you eat of it you will surely die.
- M: Tempted by Satan, Adam and Eve ate from this tree. The perfect creation was ruined. Their relationship with God was devastated.
- C: Then the man and his wife heard the sound of the Lord God as he was walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and they hid from the Lord God among the trees of the garden.
- M: But God gave to Adam and Eve the promise of a Savior, one who would set right forever what they had done wrong.
- C: So the Lord God said to the serpent, "... I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel."
- M: All of Adam and Eve's natural descendants, including each of us, have been conceived and born in sin in the image of our sinful parents.
- C: Sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned.
- M: We confess our sinful condition and our sins of thought, word, and deed:
- C: Holy and merciful Lord, I confess that I am by nature dead in sin. I have disobeyed you in many ways by doing what you forbid and by failing to do what you command. Have mercy on me, a sinner.
- M: As God promised first to Adam and Eve, he sent his own beloved Son to be the atoning sacrifice for our sins. Jesus lived a perfect life for us and died an innocent death to save us. Having heard your confession, I as God's called servant forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Taste and see that the Lord is good; blessed is the one who takes refuge in him.

Oh, Taste and See



PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray. Father of lights, every good and perfect gift comes from you. Inspire us to think those things that are true and long for those things that are good, that we may always make our petitions according to your gracious will; through your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

C: Amen.

AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM (10:00 AM)

- M: In the name of the Father and of the Son (†) and of the Holy Spirit.
- C: Amen.
- M: Our Lord Jesus Christ gave his Church the command to baptize when he said: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you."

Scripture makes plain the universal need for Baptism. As children of Adam, we belong to a fallen race. From our parents we inherit a sinful nature and would be lost forever unless delivered by our Lord Jesus Christ. He willingly took on himself the curse of sin and by his death on the cross redeemed us and all people.

Christ's almighty Word gives Baptism its power to save. The apostle Peter declares, "Baptism now saves you." Scripture also clearly teaches that the power and promise of Baptism is intended for young and old alike. On the day of Pentecost the apostle testified, "The promise is for you and your children and for all who are far off—for all whom the Lord our God will call." By water and the Spirit, we are born again and united with Christ and his people as members of the Church.

In having children baptized, parents do what is God-pleasing. Jesus himself invited little children to become a part of his kingdom when he said: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these. I tell you the truth, anyone who will not receive the kingdom of God like a little child will never enter it." And he took the children in his arms, put his hands on them, and blessed them.

- M: Receive the sign of the cross on the head and heart (†) to mark you as a redeemed child of Christ.
- M: Before the Lord and his Church, I ask you, was Asher baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit?

PARENTS: Yes, Asher was baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

M: The Almighty God—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—has forgiven all your sins. By your baptism, you have been born again and made a dear child of your Father in heaven.

May God strengthen you to live in your baptismal grace all the days of your life. Peace be with you.

EXHORTATION

M: Brothers and sister in Christ, our Lord commands that we teach his precious truths to all who are baptized.

Christian love therefore urges all of us, especially parents and sponsors, to assist in whatever manner possible so that Asher may remain a child of God until death. If you are willing to carry out this responsibility, then answer: Yes, as God gives me strength.

C: Yes, as God gives me strength.

PRAYER

M: Let us pray. Holy God, mighty Lord, gracious Father, through your stern judgment the unbelieving world was destroyed by the flood, but according to your great mercy, you saved Noah and his family. You engulfed stubborn Pharaoh and his army in the waters of the Red Sea but led your people through those same waters to safety on dry land. In the waters of the Jordan your own Son was baptized and anointed with the Spirit. By these signs you foreshadowed the precious, cleansing bath which you give us in Holy Baptism.

Clinging to your command and promise, we ask that you would look with favor on Asher David Lane. Through the water of Baptism all sin inherited from Adam, and any other evil he may do, was drowned in him. Set him apart from the unbelieving world and hold him safe and secure in the holy ark of the Church. Keep him always fervent in spirit and joyful in hope so that he may honor your holy name and at last receive, together with all your people, the promised inheritance of eternal life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Merciful Father in heaven, we thank you for the blessing of Baptism by which you offer and grant the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Help us to regard our baptisms as the robe of righteousness we are to wear all the days of our lives. Look with special favor on Asher and grant him a rich measure of your Spirit that he may grow in faith and godly living. Make us willing to carry out our responsibilities to those who have been baptized, so that all of us may finally come to the blessed joys of heaven, through Jesus our Lord.


From death to life, we have been raised through mercy and through grace. And God has seated us with Christ in realms of heav'nly space. Now seated by the Savior's side, we're nourished and restored, For we are served the bread of life by our most gracious Lord.

SECOND LESSON

For in Christ all the fullness of the Deity lives in bodily form, and you have been given fullness in Christ, who is the head over every power and authority. In him you were also circumcised, in the putting off of the sinful nature, not with a circumcision done by the hands of men but with the circumcision done by Christ, having been buried with him in baptism and raised with him through your faith in the power of God, who raised him

from the dead. When you were dead in your sins and in the uncircumcision of your sinful nature, God made you alive with Christ. He forgave us all our sins, having canceled the written code, with its regulations, that was against us and that stood opposed to us; he took it away, nailing it to the cross. And having disarmed the powers and authorities, he made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them by the cross.



When Jesus heard what had happened, he withdrew by boat privately to a solitary place. Hearing of this, the crowds followed him on foot from the towns. When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and healed their sick. As evening approached, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a remote place, and it's already getting late. Send the crowds away, so they can go to the villages and buy themselves some food." Jesus replied, "They do not need to go away. You give them something to eat." "We have here

only five loaves of bread and two fish," they answered. "Bring them here to me," he said. And he directed the people to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke the loaves. Then he gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the people. They all ate and were satisfied, and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over. The number of those who ate was about five thousand men, besides women and children.

100 Grace members participated in the Member Feedback Meetings held on July 15 at both Grace sites. We appreciate your involvement in the discussion and the direction you gave us. Based on the overwhelming support for the idea of a paid, part-time Music Coordinator to serve both sites and suggestions you proposed, the church council would like to go forward in this way:

- 1. Begin receiving donations to the Music Fund immediately. Some have indicated that they will support this right away so that we can get a person started as soon as possible. If you would like to do this, please include your donation in your regular envelope with "Music Fund—Coordinator" written on the front. A regular envelope with "Music Fund—Coordinator" written on it will also work. *Please do this over and above your regular offerings as we are currently working with a deficit.
- 2. Any Grace member interested in the position may submit a resume to the church office by August 6th. There should be enough information in the MFM handout to explain what the position entails, but any questions may be directed to Pastor Koehler. Copies of that handout are available in the Fellowship Hall at Grace-University or may be emailed to those interested. The Pastors and Council will consider the applicants and ask someone to serve as our new Music Coordinator once we have money and commitments to cover the remainder of 2012. We are not planning to ask the congregation to use the Perpetual Memorial Fund or the General Bequest Fund as we begin this new position.
- 3. The council will be considering how to handle the cost of this position for 2013. They appreciate your continued advice and encouragement.

A Request for Your Help

Below are a few paragraphs by Tonya, 12-year old Addison's mother, explaining their situation.

In May of 2011, our daughter, Addison, fell ill with a bacterial infection. Addie spent 5 months in the Pedicatric ICU, and during that time was so ill that on several occasions doctors and nurses were certain she would die. She did not die. Now, almost a year and a half since she first got sick, our Addison is a living, breathing miracle. She required a lung transplant to survive, and has been undergoing intensive physical therapy to regain her strength and health. While struggling to survive, she suffered a stroke and nerve damage that affected her ability to walk and use her hands, and caused her to be blind in one eye. Despite all of this, Addison remains the bright, happy, intelligent girl she always was. God answered our prayers, and gave her back to us, when no one thought it possible.

During Addie's hospital stay, insurance covered the millions of dollars in medical expenses, but since bringing her home last October, Insurance Co-pays, out of pocket expenses, and therapy not covered by insurance have left our family with over \$60,000 in debt and unpaid medical bills. Addison still needs more therapy, but we have used all of the therapy allowed by our insurance company. Any help with these expenses would be very much appreciated.
