
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.




All Glory Laud and Honor/Come, Now, Almighty King/O Worship the King Played by the Handbell Choir

FIRST LESSON Daniel 7:13-14




