Good Friday Tenebrae Service

Tenebrae (Latin for "darkness") is a devotional and meditative service for Good Friday. Throughout the service, candles are extinguished and lights dimmed, reminding us of the darkness that surrounded the cross on Calvary. Periods of silence may be used for prayer and reflection.

In keeping with the reverent tone of the service, worshipers are asked to both gather and leave in silence. Offering plates are left at the exits for those who desire to contribute.


