
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.



FIRST LESSON


The First Lesson is frequently a reading from the Old Testament. It shares a common theme with the Second Lesson (often from one of the epistles) and the Gospel.







DISTRIBUTION

The Bible teaches that the Lord's Supper is a unique communion of Christ and the individual believer as well as a coming together of people who hold to the same beliefs. Because of these Scriptural truths, we practice **Member Communion** at Grace. Those who are confirmed members of Wisconsin Synod congregations (WELS) are invited to receive the Lord's Supper with us.

If you are not a WELS member but have an interest in receiving Holy Communion, please speak with one of our pastors after church today or at another time. We are aware that there are a number of other teachings about Holy Communion, and we want it to be a blessing for you, so we would look forward to sharing with you what God says about this Sacrament.

We provide glutenfree communion wafers for those with wheat allergy, gluten-sensitivity or celiac disease. These wafers are stored and handled separately to avoid crosscontamination. They are "bread" as Scripture requires and are consecrated along with the rest of the bread. For those requiring gluten-free wafers, please take one from the container on the stand located at the front rail as you approach for communion. Simply hold it so that the pastor can see it at the time of distribution.

Grape juice is available for those who for health or medical reason require it instead of wine. Please speak with a pastor about providing grape juice for you on future Sundays.

Last Week to Collect for *Change for Life!*

A question was asked recently about Change for Life: "Can these young ladies really be helped, recognizing their background and problems they bring to New Beginnings?" A loving explanation of Ephesians 2:8-9 was given, emphasizing that faith does save us—literally turns our lives around—because it trusts in the saving merits of Jesus!

Excerpts were taken from "Growing Branches," a newsletter from *New Beginnings*. They come from a young woman named Mia. Her baby's name is Ariel.
