


Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

Jacob lived in the land where his father had stayed, the land of Canaan. This is the account of Jacob. Joseph, a young man of seventeen, was tending the flocks with his brothers, the sons of Bilhah and the sons of Zilpah, his father's wives, and he brought their father a bad report about them. Now Israel loved Joseph more than any of his other sons, because he had been born to him in his old age; and he made a richly ornamented robe for him. When his brothers saw that their father loved him more than any of them, they hated him and could not speak a kind word to him. Joseph had a dream, and when he told it to his brothers, they hated him all the more. He said to them, "Listen to this dream I had: We were binding sheaves of grain out in the field when suddenly

my sheaf rose and stood upright, while your sheaves gathered around mine and bowed down to it." His brothers said to him, "Do you intend to reign over us? Will you actually rule us?" And they hated him all the more because of his dream and what he had said. Then he had another dream, and he told it to his brothers. "Listen," he said, "I had another dream, and this time the sun and moon and eleven stars were bowing down to me." When he told his father as well as his brothers, his father rebuked him and said, "What is this dream you had? Will your mother and I and your brothers actually come and bow down to the ground before you?" His brothers were jealous of him, but his father kept the matter in mind.

Jacob was the twin brother of Esau and the third Hebrew Patriarch (Abraham, Isaac and Jacob). Jacob was renamed Israel by the Lord. Jacob means "heelgrabber" or "deceiver" (Genesis 25:19-26). Israel means "he struggles with God" (Genesis 32:22-32). The nation of God's people that descended from Israel's twelve sons took its name from him.

SECOND LESSON

Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death. For what the law was powerless to do in that it was weakened by the sinful nature, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful man to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in sinful man, in order that the righteous requirements of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the sinful nature but according to the Spirit. Those who live according to the sinful nature have their minds set on what that nature Romans 8:1-10 (NIV)

John 3:16 (NIV)

desires; but those who live in accordance with the Spirit have their minds set on what the Spirit desires. The mind of sinful man is death, but the mind controlled by the Spirit is life and peace; the sinful mind is hostile to God. It does not submit to God's law. nor can it do so. Those controlled by the sinful nature cannot please God. You, however, are controlled not by the sinful nature but by the Spirit, if the Spirit of God lives in you. And if anyone does not have the Spirit of Christ, he does not belong to Christ. But if Christ is in you, your body is dead because of sin, yet your spirit is alive because of righteousness.

GOSPEL Matthew 20:17-28 (NIV)

M: The Gospel according to Matthew chapter twenty.

C: Glory be to you, O Lord.

Now as Jesus was going up to Jerusalem, he took the twelve disciples aside and said to them, "We are going up to Jerusalem, and the Son of Man will be betrayed to the chief priests and the teachers of the law. They will condemn him to death and will turn him over to the Gentiles to be mocked and flogged and crucified. On the third day he will be raised to life!" Then the mother of Zebedee's sons came to Jesus with her sons and, kneeling down, asked a favor of him. "What is it you want?" he asked. She said, "Grant that one of these two sons of mine may sit at your right and the other at your left in your kingdom." "You don't know what you are asking," Jesus said to them. "Can vou drink the cup I am going to drink?"

"We can," they answered. Jesus said to them, "You will indeed drink from my cup, but to sit at my right or left is not for me to grant. These places belong to those for whom they have been prepared by my Father." When the ten heard about this, they were indignant with the two brothers. Jesus called them together and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their high officials exercise authority over them. Not so with you. Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be your slavejust as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Member Feedback Meeting Update

The Grace pastors and Church Council appreciate the 100 people who participated in the three recent MFMs. We were pleased to share with the congregation information about the requests of Peace, Sahuarita and Bethlehem, Benson to join our ministry as additional Grace sites. We were disappointed that we did not have more time for discussion. We encourage you to speak to any of the pastors or members of the church council for further information or to offer concerns or suggestions. We are planning more of these meetings as soon as we are able to assemble some of the specific financial information that was requested by those who attended the meetings. Please watch for announcements about those upcoming meetings as we continue to consider these opportunities the Lord has placed before us.

Pastor Koehler Called to Serve Peace Vacancy

Peace Lutheran Church in Sahuarita, AZ has been without a pastor since last summer. In the case of a pastoral vacancy, a vacancy pastor is typically called to provide necessary pastoral service to the congregation. The circuit pastor from Sierra Vista, AZ had been serving in this capacity, but will be completing his service on April 1.

After consulting with the other pastors and Grace's church council, Pastor Koehler has accepted Peace's call to serve as their vacancy pastor. In this case, he is asked to assist in scheduling preachers for their worship services, attend council meetings, make hospital visits and keep some office hours one day a week at Peace (this might include counseling, teaching a Bible class, etc.). He intends to begin serving on April 2 and spend time at Peace on Wednesdays. He will continue with his normal work at Grace during this time.

This is normal practice in our WELS congregations and is not related to our congregation's current discussions with Peace about possibly joining our ministries. Please keep the members of Peace in your prayers during their vacancy and as they await further discussions with Grace.

GRACE MISSION UPDATE

Peace Sahuarita Request

Peace has asked Grace to consider merging our ministries and making their congregation another Grace site.

- † Grace council is responding to member feedback by preparing financial information to share with our congregation. Member Feedback Meetings will be scheduled to share that information.
- † Pastor Koehler has accepted a Divine Call to serve as Peace's Vacancy Pastor.

Bethlehem Benson Request

Bethlehem has asked Grace to consider taking on their ministry, making them another Grace site.

- † Grace council is responding to member feedback by preparing financial information to share with our congregation. Member Feedback Meetings will be scheduled to share that information.
- † Pastor Rieke has accepted a Divine Call to serve as Bethlehem's Vacancy Pastor.

Grace-Vail Mission Funding

The WELS Board for Home Missions has partnered with Grace from the beginning of our work in Vail (\$35K/year).

- † Grace's request for a 2014-2015 fiscal year grant (\$65,000) will be considered April 3-4, 2014.
- † A BHM representative has spoken with both Pastor Rieke and Pastor Koehler in order that he might correctly present and support our request before the BHM.

Grace-Vail Facility Commitment Boards

Commitment Boards at both Grace-Vail and Grace-University allow members to remove a card indicating the amount of a gift they will add to their weekly offerings so that we might move our worship from a rented multi-purpose room in a school to a leased worship and ministry center. These commitments are anonymous but allow us to know when the financial need for the move has been met.

† Approximately \$4700 per month is needed for us to make this move. Just over half of that has been committed so far.

Vail Commitment Board

We are continuing to pursue the possibility of moving Grace-Vail out of Cottonwood Elementary School and into a seven-days-a-week retail space. The cost of operating a new full-time location is approximately \$4,700/month more than our Sunday morning rental cost. We are asking members of Grace to prayerfully consider increasing their regular, ongoing offerings to cover this difference. We rolled out a Vail Commitment Board in February which will help keep track of these commitments. There are still a number of different commitment cards for people to take ranging from \$2.50/week to \$50.00/week (in addition to current regular offerings). These card can be taken to serve as a reminder for individual members and also to allow Grace to track the congregation's commitment. Once you have prayerfully considered what you can support, please take a commitment card and begin adding that commitment to your regular offering. No other steps are necessary.

You will find the commitment board in the Grace-University Courtyard.

Pastor Rieke Called to Serve Bethlehem Vacancy

Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Benson, AZ has been served as a preaching station over the years (minimal day-to-day ministry, just worship on the weekends). They no longer have a pastor serving in this capacity and have called Pastor Rieke to conduct weekend services for them. After consulting with the other pastors and the Grace Church Council, he has agreed to serve as their Vacancy Pastor.


