
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.



THE WORD

FIRST LESSON

"The time is coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant I made with their forefathers when I took them by the hand to lead them out of Egypt, because they broke my covenant, though I was a husband to them," declares the LORD. "This is the covenant I will make with the house of

Jeremiah 31:31-34 (NIV)

Israel after that time," declares the LORD. "I will put my law in their minds and write it on their hearts. I will be their God, and they will be my people. No longer will a man teach his neighbor, or a man his brother, saying, 'Know the LORD,' because they will all know me, from the least of them to the greatest," declares the LORD. "For I will forgive their wickedness and will remember their sins no more."

The First Lesson is frequently a reading from the Old Testament. It shares a common theme with the Second Lesson (often from one of the epistles) and the Gospel.

Jesus Is the Living Stone

Based on: 1 Peter 2:4-8

He is Jesus, Rock of Ages; Our Messiah, the Prince of Peace; Lord, our refuge, strength and power, and His love will never cease. He is Alpha and Omega; the Beginning and the End! Our Redeemer, Master, Savior, Jesus, Comforter and Friend. Jesus is the firm foundation, For our sins His blood atones. He's the Rock, the mighty fortress, Jesus is the Living Stone.

The foundation never wavered, like an anchor through ev'ry storm; He's the Rock of our salvation; Jesus calms the raging storm. Yesterday, today, forever, His love reaches ev'ry man; From His birth to heaven's glory, Jesus Christ, the Great "I Am!" Jesus is the firm foundation, For our sins His blood atones. He's the Rock, the mighty fortress, Jesus is the Living Stone.

Now we know that whatever the law says, it says to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced and the whole world held accountable to God. Therefore no one will be declared righteous in his sight by observing the law; rather, through the law we become conscious of sin. But now a righteousness from God, apart from law, has been made known, to which the Law and the Prophets testify. This righteousness from God comes through faith in Jesus Christ to all who believe. There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through

the redemption that came by Christ God presented him as a Jesus. sacrifice of atonement, through faith in his blood. He did this to demonstrate his justice, because in his forbearance he had left the sins committed beforehand unpunished—he did it to demonstrate his justice at the present time, so as to be just and the one who justifies those who have faith in Jesus. Where, then, is boasting? It is excluded. On what principle? On that of observing the law? No, but on that of faith. For we maintain that a man is iustified by faith apart from observing the law.

that we shall be set free?" Jesus replied, "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin. Now a slave has no permanent place in the family, but a son belongs to it forever. So if the Son sets you free, you will be free indeed.

NICENE CREED

C: We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation, he came down from heaven, was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the virgin Mary, and became fully human. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate. He suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who in unity with the Father and the Son is worshiped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. We believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Nicene Creed was first developed in 325 at the First Council of Nicea. It was written to reaffirm the Biblical teaching of the divinity of Jesus, God's Son. Like the Apostles' and Athanasian Creeds, the Nicene Creed is a confession of what the Bible teaches.






WORDS OF INSTITUTION


Grape juice is available for those who for health or medical reason require it instead of wine. Please speak with a pastor about providing grape juice for you on future Sundays.



Our Christmas Outreach Plan includes using the latest Bible movie produced by the WELS. It is entitled *My Son, My Savior* and it tells the story of Jesus through Mary's eyes. It appears to be an excellent piece of work, like the two before it, *Road to Emmaus* and *Come Follow Me*. We have ordered cases of the DVDs and plan to have members at each site wrap them as gifts so that we can make them available at each site for members to give to unchurched friends as invitations to

Christmas services at Grace. Our Christmas service information will be included with each DVD.

Outreach to the unchurched is the primary purpose of these DVDs. However, members who would like to have their own copy or give one to family members or churched friends may make a \$5 donation to Grace's Outreach Fund for each one.

How can you be part of this Christmas Outreach?

Any of the following donations by November 15th will allow us to schedule wrapping events from November 16-29 and make them available right away.

- **1. Donate a roll of Christmas wrapping paper.** Designs may include trees, wreaths, holly, snowflakes, angels, the baby Jesus (and other Christian themes), or plain Christmas colors. Please do not choose Santa and reindeer or other designs that are quite a bit different from the story of our Savior's birth.
- 2. Donate a roll of invisible scotch tape.
- 3. Help wrap a few DVDs. We'll be announcing times at each site when this can be done.
- **4. Find an unchurched Neighbor, Acquaintance, Friend, or Relative** (or 5 or 10!) and give them one of these as a gift and invitation to worship our newborn Savior with us.
- **5. Make a donation to the Grace Outreach Fund.** Include in your regular envelope and note the special donation or use a separate envelope indicating your gift that will help us in sharing our Savior with others.
