

M: O little Child, you were our guest that weary ones in you might rest;


C: forlorn and lowly was your birth that we might rise to heav'n from earth.

FIRST LESSON Isaiah 9:2-7 (NIV)

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned. GOSPEL Luke 2:1-20 (NIV)

In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world. (This was the first census that took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria.) And everyone went to his own town to register. So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no

room for them in the inn. And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is Christ the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger." Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to men on whom

his favor rests." When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." So they hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what

had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all the things they had heard and seen, which were just as they had been told.

CONFESSION OF FAITH (Dr. Martin Luther's Explanation to the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed)

LIGHTING OF THE CANDLES

O Little Town of Bethlehem Piano/Organ Duet

The pastor takes the light of the Christ candle to the assistants. They pass the light on to the congregation. Please tip only the unlighted candle to prevent wax from dripping.

SPOKEN RESPONSES

- M: Rejoice! The Light of the World has come. That light transforms us with the brightness of His glory.
 - This is the message we have heard from Him and proclaimed to you: that God is light and in Him is no darkness at all.
- C: If we say we have fellowship with Him but still walk in darkness, we lie, and do not live according to the truth.
- M: But if we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another;
- C: And the blood of Jesus His Son cleanses us from all our sins.
- M: You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and then cover its light. Instead they set the lamp on its stand, set up high, and it lights everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before everyone, that they may see your good works and give praise to your Father in heaven.
 - Let us pray. O God, as You make us glad by the yearly festival of the birth of Your only-begotten Son Jesus Christ, grant that we, who joyfully receive Him as our Redeemer, may with sure confidence behold Him when He comes to be our judge; who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
- C: Amen.
- M: The almighty and merciful God, the Father, the (†) Son, and the Holy Spirit bless you now and forever.
- C: Amen! Glory to God in the highest! And peace to His people on earth!
