
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

M: For the steadfast assurance that nothing can separate us from your love and for the courage to stand firm against the assaults of Satan and every evil, hear our prayer, O Christ.




M: For the well-being of your holy Church in all the world and for those who offer here their worship and praise, hear our prayer, O Lord.

THE WORD

The First Lesson is frequently a reading from the Old Testament. It shares a common theme with the Second Lesson (often from one of the epistles) and the Gospel.

FIRST LESSON

Manasseh was twelve years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem fifty-five years. He did evil in the eyes of the LORD, following the detestable practices of the nations the LORD had driven out before the Israelites. He rebuilt the high places his father Hezekiah had demolished: he also erected altars to the Baals and made Asherah poles. He bowed down to all the starry hosts and worshiped them. He built altars in the temple of the LORD, of which the LORD had said, "My Name will remain in Jerusalem forever." In both courts of the temple of the LORD, he built altars to all the starry hosts. He sacrificed his sons in the fire in the Valley of Ben Hinnom, practiced sorcery, divination and witchcraft, and consulted mediums and spiritists. He did much evil in the eyes of the LORD, provoking him to anger.

The LORD spoke to Manasseh and his people, but they paid no attention. So the LORD brought against them the army commanders of the king of Assyria, who took Manasseh prisoner, put a hook in his nose, bound him with bronze shackles and took him to Babylon. In his distress he sought the favor of the LORD his God and humbled


himself greatly before the God of his fathers. And when he prayed to him, the LORD was moved by his entreaty and listened to his plea; so he brought him back to Jerusalem and to his kingdom. Then Manasseh knew that the LORD is God. Afterward he rebuilt the outer wall of the City of David, west of the Gihon spring in the valley, as far as the entrance of the Fish Gate and encircling the hill of Ophel; he also made it much higher. He stationed military commanders in all the fortified cities in Judah. He got rid of the foreign gods and removed the image from the temple of the LORD, as well as all the altars he had built on the temple hill and in Jerusalem; and he threw them out of the city. Then he restored the altar of the LORD and sacrificed fellowship offerings and thank offerings on it, and told Judah to serve the LORD, the God of Israel. The people, however, continued to sacrifice at the high places, but only to the LORD their God. The other events of Manasseh's reign, including his prayer to his God and the words the seers spoke to him in the name of the LORD, the God of Israel, are written in the annals of the kings of Israel.

SECOND LESSON

Do you not know that the wicked will not inherit the kingdom of God? Do not be deceived: Neither the sexually immoral nor idolaters nor adulterers nor male prostitutes nor homosexual offenders nor thieves nor the greedy nor drunkards nor slanderers nor

swindlers will inherit the kingdom of God. And that is what some of you were. But you were washed, you were sanctified, you were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ and by the Spirit of our God.

GOSPEL

Now one of the Pharisees invited Jesus to have dinner with him, so he went to the Pharisee's house and reclined at the table. When a woman who had lived a sinful life in that town learned that Jesus was eating at the Pharisee's house, she brought an alabaster jar of perfume, and as she stood behind him at his feet weeping, she began to wet his feet with her tears. Then she wiped them with her hair, kissed them and poured perfume on them. When the Pharisee who had invited him saw this, he said to himself, "If this man were a prophet, he would know who is touching him and what kind of woman she is-that she is a sinner." Jesus answered him, "Simon, I have something to tell you." "Tell me, teacher," he said. "Two men owed money to a certain moneylender. One owed him five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. Neither of them had the money to pay him back, so he canceled the debts of both. Now

which of them will love him more?" Simon replied, "I suppose the one who had the bigger debt canceled." "You have judged correctly," Jesus said. Then he turned toward the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I came into your house. You did not give me any water for my feet, but she wet my feet with her tears and wiped them with her hair. You did not give me a kiss, but this woman, from the time I entered, has not stopped kissing my feet. You did not put oil on my head, but she has poured perfume on my feet. Therefore, I tell you, her many sins have been forgiven-for she loved much. But he who has been forgiven little loves little." Then Jesus said to her, "Your sins are forgiven." The other guests began to say among themselves, "Who is this who even forgives sins?" Jesus said to the woman, "Your faith has saved you; go in peace."








DISTRIBUTION


The Bible teaches that the Lord's Supper is a unique communion of Christ and the individual believer as well as a coming together of people who hold to the same beliefs. Because of these Scriptural truths, we practice **Member Communion** at Grace. Those who are confirmed members of Wisconsin Synod congregations (WELS) are invited to receive the Lord's Supper with us.

If you are not a WELS member but have an interest in receiving Holy Communion, please speak with one of our pastors after church today or at another time. We are aware that there are a number of other teachings about Holy Communion, and we want it to be a blessing for you, so we would look forward to sharing with you what God says about this Sacrament.

We provide glutenfree communion wafers for those with wheat allergy, gluten-sensitivity or celiac disease. These wafers are stored and handled separately to avoid cross-contamination. They are "bread" as Scripture requires and are consecrated along with the rest of the bread. For those requiring gluten-free wafers, please take one from the container on the stand located at the front rail as you approach for communion. Simply hold it so that the pastor can see it at the time of distribution.

Grape juice is available for those who for health or medical reason require it instead of wine. Please speak with a pastor about providing grape juice for you on future Sundays.

New Multi-Site Congregation in Arizona!

Although Grace is the only 4-site congregation in the WELS, more of our congregations are realizing the benefits of becoming a multi-site church. Merging two existing congregations to preserve and strengthen church locations and establishing new mission sites are two common reasons to do this. Pastors around the country are contacting us to hear how we have done it and how we are doing. While we don't have all the answers and we're still working on many things, the Lord is certainly blessing us and it is a blessing to be able to help our brothers and sisters in Christ as they embark on a similar journey! Below is an excerpt from the most recent WELS *Together* publication, sharing the exciting news for another Arizona congregation and one we've had the privilege of sharing with as they worked toward this day!

Earlier this month the Board for Home Missions (BHM) authorized funding for a new mission as well as for enhancing a self-supporting ministry. The new mission is a multi-site effort of Cross of Glory, Peoria, Arizona. Cross of Glory, a congregation of 269 members in the greater Phoenix area, is planning to establish a second site in nearby Vistancia, a growing community eight miles west of the congregation. The community's current population is 16,000, but it is projected to grow to more than 70,000 people; currently only one Protestant church is in the area. Cross of Glory already has been canvassing in that community. Funding will allow the congregation to provide the necessary facilities in Vistancia and to call a second pastor to lead outreach efforts, do prospect follow-up, and eventually begin Bible study and worship services at the new site.

2015 WELS Convention Preview

On Saturday, June 6, the pastors, male teachers, and lay representatives from many congregations within our Saguaro Circuit (Tucson and southeastern Arizona) met to prepare for the Synod Convention, which takes place July 27-30 in Saginaw, Michigan. Grace was represented by three laymen who each worship regularly at a different site. We were unable to find a representative from Benson whose schedule could include the meeting. Grace asked these representatives to each write a summary of the experience to share with their respective site. Below is Dennis Miller's description.

I enjoyed being involved as a layperson representative for the BORAM (Book of Reports and Memorials) meeting. I know the synod is very busy around the world, but this close up look gave me a very good glimpse of exactly how much they are doing. The outlook for the goals of the synod are ambitious, and they rely on congregations contributing on CMO (Congregational Mission Offerings). It is amazing how much support our congregations give the synod through their offerings! As presented in the BORAM, the goals the synod is trying to achieve all have the people ready to work toward achieving them. The reports are very thorough as to what they wish to do. What is not presented is a plan for how they intend to fund the programs outside of CMO. It is clear by their reports they do not expect to meet the financial needs needed to accomplish all their goals. Some choices will have to be made as to what projects can be completed now, which will have to wait, and which will be cut. I do not envy the choices leaders in these areas will have to make, as all of their goals would be a blessing to our synod, our colleges, and those who would hear the gospel if the programs were to be funded. They should/need to look for other funding options to meet their goals outside the CMO in order to meet their ambitious goals. As for the CMO, only we as a congregation can increase our CMO. We can either come up with our own fundraising plans for the CMO or increase giving toward the CMO while still balancing our ambitious goals as a congregation.

ALA Gaining Ground Support

Arizona Lutheran Academy (ALA), our area Lutheran High School in Phoenix, has been offered an opportunity to purchase land adjacent to its current property. This land is a highly desirable corner lot which would provide excellent visibility for the school and offers many options for its immediate and long-term use. And the land is being offered to ALA for approximately half of its market value. ALA's Board of Directors has decided to go forward with an aggressive campaign to be able to complete the purchase and to fund a number of other vital needs. The goal is to raise one million dollars by the end of September of this year, the deadline for making the final payment on the property.

At their meeting in May, Grace's voters approved a plan for Grace to support this campaign and to encourage interested members to do the same. They approved an expenditure of up to \$10,000 from the General Bequest Fund to be used to match the first \$10,000 that Grace members contribute to this effort. You can support this effort with special gifts to the "ALA Land Fund" that has been established at Grace. The first \$10,000 in donations received to this fund will be matched and sent to ALA for their "Gaining Ground" campaign. Learn more about the this campaign at ALA's website, www.alacovotes.org.

Voters' Meeting Update

In addition to the support for ALA's Gaining Ground Campaign, the voters approved several changes to Grace's bylaws, including one to grant voting rights on the Church Council to the representatives from Grace-Benson and Grace-Sahuarita. They adjusted the 2015 Ministry Spending Plan (MSP) to reflect our current situation and the fact that a pastor has not yet accepted our Call to serve in Sahuarita. Grace's voters also approved a plan to provide an annual scholarship to Grace members who are students at Wisconsin Lutheran College (WELS) and Bethany Lutheran College (ELS).

Call Declined

After much prayer and careful deliberation, Pastor Brian Hackmann has announced his decision to decline the Call extended to him to serve as Grace's Mission Pastor to Sahuarita.
