
Hymns are found in our hymnal, *Christian Worship*, which is the red book in the pew rack in front of you.

WELCOME to the Lord's house and to worship of our loving **Savior Triune God** - **Father, Son, and Holy Spirit**. May our worship here together be truly blessed and edifying to each one of us in our Christian faith.

Our worship service will take the form of a **FESTIVAL OF WORD AND SONG**, based upon the church's tradition of Scripture reading and hymn singing, a practice particularly popular at the time of Martin Luther.

We begin with a devotion based upon a portion of God's Word, followed by a series of Scripture readings emphasizing the theme of our worship service concert, "OUR LIFE IN CHRIST." Each Scripture reading will be underscored by the playing of a chorale prelude introducing the melody and mood of a congregational hymn to follow. Immediately following the prelude we will join in singing the chorale hymn. Please keep this service folder handy alongside your hymnal for direction pertaining to the singing of the particular hymn stanzas. No introduction other than the organ prelude will be given before the singing of each hymn.

Let us all now join to "make a joyful noise unto the Lord our God" (Psalm 98:4), "sing forth the honor of His name," and make His praise glorious!" (Psalm 66:2).

There is no difference, for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified freely by his grace through the redemption that came by Christ Jesus. P: In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord seated on a throne, high and exalted, and the train of his robe filled the temple. Above him were seraphs, each with six wings: With two wings they covered their faces, with two they covered their feet, and with two they were flying. And they were calling to one another: "Holy, holy, holy is the LORD Almighty; the whole earth is full of his glory." At the sound of their voices the doorposts and thresholds shook and the temple was filled with smoke. "Woe to me!" I cried. "I am ruined! For I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips, and my eyes have seen the King, the LORD Almighty." Charles Bonow was born in Winona, Minnesota, and was raised with his three brothers and two sisters on his parents' farm near Lewiston, Minnesota. Having parents who were intent on providing their children with a Christian education, he attended and graduated from St. John Lutheran School, Dr. Martin Luther High School, Northwestern College, and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. From 1975-1979 he served as Pastor of Hope Ev. Lutheran Church, St. Charles, Michigan. In 1977 God blessed him with a faithful helpmate by joining him in marriage with Sandra Cox of Flint, Michigan. They are the parents of two sons, Joseph and Jared, whom the Lord has also blessed with faithful helpmates, Tonia and Kelly, respectively. Charles and Sandra are thus now "empty-nestled" in Lewiston, Minnesota and are members of St. John Lutheran Church.

Charles Bonow has as his full-time ministry the presentation each week of his service concerts in our churches in all parts of the country. He, with the help of his wife, pursues this extensive work with the prayer that through such a ministry of God's Word and song the name of our saving Lord will truly be hallowed and His Kingdom continue to come.

To better equip himself for his ministry, Charles Bonow has studied organ with Byron Blackmore, former professor of organ at the University of Wisconsin, LaCrosse; music theory and composition with Jeff C. Krauklis, LaCrosse; and organ performance and hymn improvisation with Dr. Paul Manz, the foremost and profoundly influential Lutheran organist and composer of church music of our time.
