In August 2005 Grace Presbyterian Church and many other congregations in Houston found themselves surrounded by proximity with many Katrina evacuees from Louisiana. Grace Presbyterian Church adopted 75 families from New Orleans (250 individuals). Breakthrough Ministry was the collaborative effort of the Reverend Orin Grant and Michele Shultz Hendrix developed to help Louisiana residents understand in the midst of "change" that large and small churches can partner in ministry together, across cultural, racial, and denominational barriers. Reverend Grant will share the significance of partnering in ministry and offer insights into a change that has been contagious, continuous and compassionate and how it affected and benefited the congregations and their communities.

 Alzheimer's Disease: Changing Patterns of Behavior! – Ginny Nyhuis, Community Outreach Coordinator, Alzheimer's Association of Southeastern Wisconsin
