BIRTH OF THE WHITE HOUSE



Construction of the White House began on October 13, 1792. Much of the work on the house was performed by enslaved and freed African-Americans as well as immigrants, many not yet with citizenship. The initial construction took place over a period of eight years, at a reported cost of \$232,371.83 (equal to \$3,239,992 today).

Following traditional Japanese design principles, all nails and fasteners in the gardens are recessed. Wood is notched and aged. There is no stain on the wood used in the fencing, entryway or the gazebos. Hayward Japanese Gardens is the oldest Japanese
