I appreciate your kind expressions of sympathy following the

death of my former pastor, Herb Hodges. While many authors, preachers and professors have shaped my understanding of the Bible and ministry, no one compares to the

personal investment and time Herb spent over the past 48 years of my life. Herb was there for a number of milestones in our family's life. He led Myra to Christ and baptized her; he officiated our wedding and 1½ years later our first child's dedication; he preached my ordination message; and officiated the funeral services

for both of my parents.

It was my joy to have had Herb in our church at least four times

since 1994. Because he was provocative and challenging in his teaching, there were times people were rubbed the wrong way. However, Herb grew on people who

took the time to carefully consider the biblical basis of his messages (Tom Young alluded to that in his recent Sunday message).

His provocative title of my ordination message raised a few eyebrows, but made a memorable challenge. The title was "Be an Ass for Christ." using the KJV's word
