We gave out over 300 hygiene bags to volcano victims, orphans, and those working in the dump. We also went to a community called Yalu (rural Guatemala) and gave out thousands of meals from Feed My Starving Children. We met many people over this past week and were able to pray for them.

One man who was affected by the recent volcano eruption lost his wife and three of his four children. We also met a 7 year old boy who was a part of Believe in the VBS program whose parents both died and has an abusive un-

cle. These are just a couple of the many heartbreaking stories that we heard and where able to pray over them.

But in the short time we were there God revealed His sovereignty and power to us. There is a great need, but our God is even greater! Thank you all so much for those of you who prayed for us and for all the many donations we were able to bless those with. God is on the move in Guatemala as well!
