Beloved,

We have had a month of inperson worship services and continued online worship. The good news is that between all three services, we have been recording normal or above average attendance. The options of Thursday and online services have worked well for those who might be out for weekend travels or vacations. However, we are still limited in capacity by social distancing suggestions, and we have not resumed in-person classes.

Of all our ministries, it is perhaps our preschool and children's ministries that have borne the brunt of curtailed meetings. We have decided to cancel Vacation Bible School this summer. However, I appreciate our teachers for their attempts to maintain the church's role in coming alongside parents in the spiritual development of children. We realize that we are still missing some of our children through online meetings. Consequently, our teachers will be attempting to contact parents to see what you most need from us during this time.

Over the last year, we have been in conversation with Pat Prentice regarding an internship at Crest. Pat and his daughter, Summer, spent eight months at Crest in 2014 while his wife, Kathryn (Kat), was in military training.
