This month I just wanted to share something that God's been teaching me recently. In the last few months, we've all learned a lot about the world, about our coun-



try, about the people close to us, and about ourselves. We have seen difficult times bring out both the best and worst in people. We've had to make decisions about things that we never would have imagined even a year ago.

God's been working on teaching me humility for a long, long time, but particularly in the last few months, He's been showing me that I do not always know as much as I think I do.

My take-away lesson has been this: hold your opinions with an open hand. Let me explain. I have a lot of opinions. About myself, about others, about God, about the way things really are, about the way I think they should be. I don't hold these opinions, thinking they're wrong, but my goal is to hold them with an open hand. I may have an opinion about the way things SHOULD be, but I have often found that I am wrong.
