Did you miss the first Stop Hunger Now packing event? Mark your calendar now so you won't miss this time.

October 9 at 3pm at Craigs Baptist All ages needed—especially Youth to help carry things, Adults to help pack, Seniors to weigh and seal the packets, Musically inclined to sing along, and everyone who can enjoy fellowship and a good time. The best part is that you will be helping hungry people receive a nutritious meal. The assembly process combines rice, soy, dehydrated vegetables and a

flavoring mix including 21 essential vitamins and minerals into small meal packets. Each meal costs only 25 cents. The food stores easily, has a shelf-life of five years and transports quickly.

To prepare for the Stop Hunger Now event, WOM will sponsor collection of Quarters (and any other monies) to purchase the supplies during March to August. Goal for Goshen is to purchase \$10,000 worth of supplies. **Let's see if OBC can help contribute by sending \$1,000 to purchase 4,000 meals!**

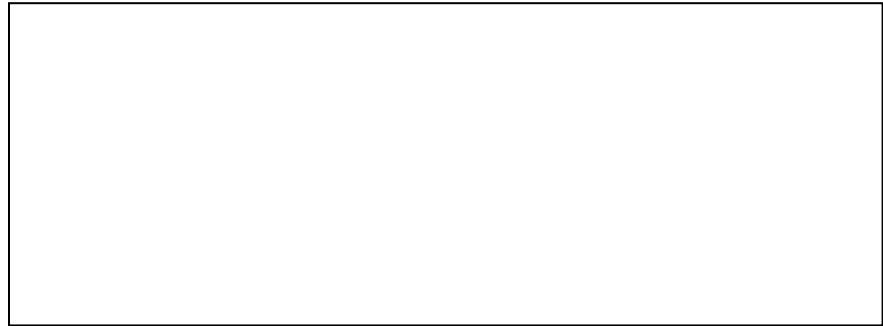
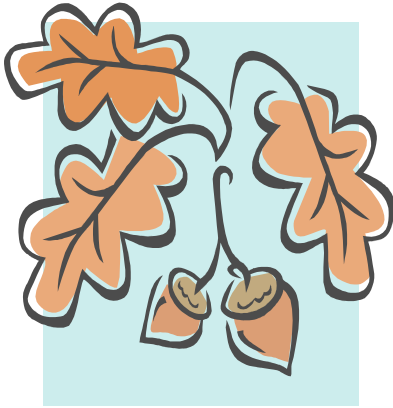
