Dear Friends,

Several years ago, congregations across our Texas Annual Conference began adopting a model of structure known as the Single Board Model. At this point, the estimated number of Single Board Model churches in the TAC is 57. That information came from our conference's Office of Congregational Excellent.

Single Board Model, also known as "Board of Stewards," was a model utilized by the Methodist Church used until shortly after WW II, when protestant churches began to implement age-level and specialty ministry committees. Single Board was brought back to use recently because it allows administrative boards and committees (Board of Trustees, Staff/Pastor-Parish, and Finance committees) to meet together at one time. Decisions about ministry that once were required to delay new initiatives for weeks or months are made at one meeting time with Single Board.

This is basically how Single Board works. Nominations and Lay Leadership Committee identify three representatives from each of the administrative areas – Board of Trustees, Staff/Pastor Parish Relations Committee, and Finance Committee – to serve on the Board of Stewards. The Board of Stewards meets on a regular basis to administer all of those areas in one meeting. On the meeting agenda, when it's time to give attention to trustee matters, all the stewards give attention to trustees. When it's time to give attention to the financial matters of the church, all the stewards give attention to finance. You get the idea.

Single Board Model does not involve the ministry committees, like Missions or Evangelism, nor does it change anything about Nominations and Lay Leadership Committee. We will still have a Treasurer. The Board of Stewards replaces Board of Trustees, Staff/Pastor Parish Relations and Finance Committees as independent groups. And it also replaces Administrative Board. The ministry teams will continue to meet and communicate on a regular basis.

Implementation of Single Board at any church must be voted on by the entire church membership in a church conference that is presided over by the district superintendent or a designated elder.

Our Administrative Board voted favorably in April for information on the Single Board Model to be presented to the congregation at large. The proposed new structure will be presented in three town hall meetings, scheduled at various times so that everyone has an opportunity to learn about the model, during May, June and July.

Our first town hall meeting will be on Thursday, May 16th in the Activity Center at 6:30 PM. I will give a Power Point presentation and distribute written information as well. We'll have a time of questions and answers, as time allows, following the presentation. The dates of the other town hall meetings will be published soon.

As I approached the city of Franklin four days after a tornado had torn through it, I saw trees up-ended with their roots exposed to the sky, fences recently patched to keep cattle in the fields, and random pieces of debris lodged in the branches of trees or along the side of the highway. When I entered First UMC of Franklin, I expected to see stacks of relief supplies but instead I saw piles and piles of plastic Easter eggs. Easter was only a few days away and someone's heart skipped over what was being handled by everyone else – water, garbage bags, chain saws – and thought about the children who might possibly go without an Easter egg hunt this year.

Rev. Polly Standing, FUMC Franklin's pastor, ushered me around the most



devastated neighborhood, weaving in and around emergency vehicles, waving at county officials and stopping to visit with work teams who were piling up lumber that had once been someone's home. She even stopped to call a veterinarian whom she knew was willing to take in lost animals. And one of the work teams had befriended one such dog, at once friendly and showing signs of being injured.

When we stopped at a distribution center I talked to a woman named Gloria. She's recently retired and is heavily involved with the day-to-day operation at her church, now helping families replace pantry and closet





items. I told her the families who had already lost so much were blessed to have

her helping them when she looked at me and said, "Well, I know how much they need the help. My house was brought down to the ground three days ago." My heart broke for her.

Thank you to everyone who donated needed items that I was able to deliver to Rev. Polly. She was blown away by



the items, the donations from three of the UMW circles and the gift cards from another circle. Thanks for your generosity. As Gloria told me, "You just don't know how much you appreciate someone coming and helping in any little way until you're the one who needs the help."

Coda: We all shared in the global tragedy that was the fire at Notre Dame Cathedral in Paris. As the cathedral was burning, groups of people gathered to pray and sing hymns. In thinking about the fire at the cathedral I thought back to high school. When I was in high school First Presbyterian of Navasota caught fire. The sanctuary, built in 1894, had to be extensively repaired and restored. The piano in the sanctuary had to be replaced. The organ needed to be rebuilt almost entirely. Almost everything in the sanctuary and downstairs fellowship hall had to be taken out and refinished. Today, on the wall leading from the choir room up the stairs to the sanctuary, there is a picture of the choir from the early 1900's. I see it every week when I stop by to practice organ. And I'm always struck by how deeply connected we are through the making of music. It is as essential to our nature as breathing. I find tremendous comfort in knowing, though change and tragedy will come, beating time in the background there will always be people making music.
