A Lenten Pilgrimage: From Death to Life

First United Methodist Church is offering an abundant variety of opportunities to experience, "A Lenten Pilgrimage" and move "from death to life." You are invited to the regular weekly worship and Sunday school, as well as the special Lenten offerings for study, meditation, and spiritual growth,

Shrove Tuesday – Mardi Gras February 28th – 5:00 p.m. – Activity Center

Mardi Gras or "Fat Tuesday" is the traditional time when European Christians would get rid of all the fat in their cupboards, so there would be no temptation to cheat during the fasting of Lent. Of course, the best way to get rid of fattening foods is to eat. And, the best way to eat is to throw a big party! Everyone is invited to a Shrove Tuesday/Mardi Gras party with gumbo, entertainment, and cakes.

Ash Wednesday March 1st – 7:00 p.m. - Sanctuary

The first day of Lent is Ash Wednesday. This day goes back hundreds of years in Christian tradition as the time each year for the person of faith to begin examining in depth his or her relationship to God. After a brief worship experience, everyone who desires to express their penitence will be invited to receive a symbolic cross of ashes.

Wednesday Lenten Book Study March 8, 15, 22, 29, April 5

5:00 p.m. – light meal followed by study

Each Wednesday during Lent Pastor Bill and Pastor Kay will be leading "The Creed, What Christians Believe and Why" by Adam Hamilton. For Christians, the beliefs expressed in the Apostles' Creed are foundational. In this book we'll consider those beliefs and begin a conversation about what Christians believe, why they believe it, and why it matters. Cost of the book is \$14.00.

Holy Week April 9th-16th

The Christian faith takes time seriously because God takes time seriously. God incarnated the Word into a real time and place as Jesus Christ. Marking the important "times" of Jesus' life helps us mark God's time in our daily lives. With Holy Week comes the observance of climactic events of Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. By remembering these events in special ways, we participate again in the basic beliefs of the faith.

Maundy Thursday Communion

April 13th – 7:00 p.m. - Sanctuary

“Maundy” is Latin for mandate, referring to Jesus’ new commandment in John 13:34-35. This commandment was given during the Last Supper as Jesus shared the sacrament of Holy Communion with his disciples for the first time. The context for that significant meal was the Jewish Passover, a meal which is still observed in synagogues and Jewish homes as the Seder. The youth will be leading this service.

Good Friday Tenebrae Service

April 14th – 7:00 p.m.- Sanctuary

The service of Tenebrae or “shadows” grew out of a combination night and early morning prayer. The word “Tenebrae” is from the Latin for darkness. This night we remember the darkness that fell upon the world between the crucifixion and Easter morning. This service is designed to create an atmosphere of somber contemplation and pensive reflection. The sanctuary choir will give leadership to this service.

Easter Morning Worship Services

April 16th – Sunrise Service-6:55 a.m., 8:15 a.m., 9:00 a.m., 11:00 a.m.

The Sunrise Service will be held in the amphitheater at Hohlt Park.

Christians have always gathered on Easter Sunday to recall the overwhelming experience of the women and men who first saw the empty tomb. There is no holier day on the Christian calendar as Easter Sunday’s celebration of the Resurrection. The Lenten Pilgrimage: From Death to Life” will bring new life and meaning in Jesus Christ.

Lent



Lent is composed of the 40 days between Ash Wednesday (March 1) and Easter (April 16), not including the Sundays of those six weeks. It has long been the practice of the church to understand Sundays as mini-Easters anticipating the Day of Resurrection. The word Lent comes from the Anglo-Saxon meaning “*spring*” and is traditionally understood as a time of fasting and penance in preparation for Easter.

The Great Three Days, sometimes called Triduum or Pasch, beginning with sunset on Maundy Thursday through sunset on Easter, conclude Lent and declare the mystery of Christ’s death and resurrection. Each year, we travel with Jesus through the Last Supper, the prayers and betrayal in the garden, the Crucifixion, and the empty tomb. We rejoice with alleluias on Easter morning for the gifts of salvation and life that overcomes death.

Lent has also been understood as a time of preparation for the renewal of our baptismal covenant. In the early church, candidates for baptism spent as long as three years preparing to be baptized. Later, Lent became that time when all Christians were invited to consider their need for spiritual renewal. This was common practice by the time of the Council of Nicea in 325 A.D.



According to *The United Methodist Book of Worship*, “*Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. . . . The service focus is on the dual themes of sin and death in the light of God’s redeeming love in Jesus Christ.*” Ash Wednesday then is a time to reflect on our nature as finite, sinful people and on God’s nature as forgiving and redeeming. On Sunday morning, many of us confess our sins and declare that we are sinners. Ash Wednesday gives us the occasion to stop – or at least to slow down – and to reflect on what exactly it means for us to acknowledge that we are sinners and that we will die. Recognizing these realities gives depth to our gratitude for God’s love and grace.

Many are in the habit of “*giving something up for Lent,*” often an item like chocolate or sweets. While calories are fewer for the faithful, such discipline does little to transform lives. Besides, “*giving up*” these things often leave us dour and cranky. Instead of “*giving up*” sweets, let me invite you to “*take up*” the daily reading of scripture, involvement in a weekly small group study, and participation in weekly worship. By infusing our lives with reading the Bible, Christian conversation, and six consecutive weeks of worship, we can honor Christ and seek a deeper faith experience during Lent.

Please read Pastor Kay’s article in the newsletter to discover all of the things we are doing at Brenham First United Methodist Church to observe Lent.
