Happy 175th Anniversary First United Methodist Church of Brenham!

Imagine, for a moment, being one of the Texas Methodists who had to secretly in homes throughout the state because only Roman Catholics were allowed to worship legally. Only a year after Texas won her independence, three circuit riders came to openly serve those home groups.

Brenham First United Methodist had its beginning from two congregations: Giddings Memorial Methodist Church and the Fourth Street Methodists (German-speaking.) In 1844 a group of Methodists, under the leadership of J.D. Giddings, met in the Hickory Grove School, located at 804 Crockett Street in Brenham. The congregation and Sunday school were organized and they chose Mr. Giddings as the superintendent of Sunday School.

The Fourth Street Methodists started meeting as a Germanspeaking congregation. Their building was constructed in 1874, where the present Presbyterian Church is located. The west wing of the Presbyterian Church is the original Fourth Street Methodist Church building. It was in this building that Blinn College has its beginning. Blinn College was begun as a college for German-speaking Methodist divinity students.

In November of 1938, the two congregations merged, forming the Brenham Methodist Church, which would become The United Methodist Church in 1968.

As we prepare to celebrate our 175th year of Methodist ministry in Brenham, we hope to honor our heritage and history in worship and special events. If you would like to help plan the 2019 175th Anniversary of our church, please come to an organizational meeting on Monday, October 8th in the Fellowship Room (by the church office.)

After the funeral, when the cards and flowers have stopped coming, most of the people around you return to their normal lives. But your grief continues.

Often, friends and family want to help you, but don't know how. That's the reason for GriefShare. Our group will be led by Pastor Bobbie Maltas and lay support helpers, Joy Goedeke and Sue Hewitt. We have all experienced grief after the death of a loved one and have successfully rebuilt our lives. We understand how you feel because we've been in the same place. We will walk with you on the long path through grief toward healing and hope for the future. Please allow us to help.

GriefShare is a weekly grief support group for people who are grieving the death of a family member or friend. Weekly meetings include a DVD presentation with helpful information featuring leading grief recovery experts, Small group discussion about the video content and how the group can be supportive of each individual. <u>Childcare is available</u>. Each participant will receive a workbook for journaling and personal study exercises that reinforce the weekly session topics. Workbooks are \$15.00; scholarships available.

In thinking about the multiple opportunities to make music in worship, I began to think about what happens when we make music together.

Specifically, what happens to our hearts when we make music together. I don't mean heart in the metaphorical sense that we often talk about, but our actual organ. Curiously, when we listen to music, and especially when we make music together, our heart rates will start to shift to match the tempo of the music. In a very literal sense, when we make music together in worship, our hearts are starting to beat as one. Music is so profoundly linked to our emotions as well as our physical well being. It only makes sense that if music is tied to our emotional and physical state that it would be tied to our spiritual state as well. Which is why we sing, we play, and we experience music in worship.

"Lay so much stress on opinions, that all your own, if it be possible, may agree with truth and reason; but have a care of anger, dislike, or contempt towards those whose opinions differ from yours. You are daily accused of this; (and, indeed, what is it whereof you are not accused?) but beware of giving any ground for such an accusation. Condemn no man for not thinking as you think: Let everyone enjoy the full and free liberty of thinking for himself: Let every man use his own judgment, since every man must give an account of himself to God. Abhor every approach, in any kind or degree, to the spirit of persecution. If you cannot reason or persuade a man into the truth, never attempt to force him into it. If love will not compel him to come in, leave him to God, the Judge of all."
