The Sanctuary Cross

You may be wondering when the scaffolding at the west facing doors to our sanctuary might be coming down. We are making much progress so that it will be sooner rather than later and we now have accurate numbers for the final cost. We have received donations to cover the cost for the casting of the cross and its base and temporarily used cash reserve funds to begin the rest of the casting and replacement work. After the new stone is cast it must cure for several weeks before it is installed. We are hoping to have this project completed before Thanksgiving and the beginning of Advent.

In an effort to restore our cash reserves, we are requesting each family in our congregation to consider making a special gift toward this project. We understand our community's economic situation and our need to not affect regular giving, so this would be a gift that is above and beyond our planned giving. If you are able to provide a special gift to help restore our sanctuary to its created state, please note "The Cross Project" on your gift. Whether you are able to give or not, your consideration of this opportunity is very deeply appreciated.



Do Not Rob God

"Bring the full tithe into the storehouse, so that there may be food in my house.

Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open
the floodgates of heaven for you and pour out so much blessing
that you will not have room enough for it." Malachi 3:10

This passage in Malachi holds both a challenge and a promise. The challenge for us is to bring our full tithe into the church so that we can fulfill our mission and calling of transforming lives and helping people grow in their faith. The promise is that when we do, God will pour out a blessing on us.

I have heard some say that it is impossible to give a tenth of our income. If we did that, we might not be able to pay our other bills. Still others have said that giving a tenth of what we earn could leave us without a cushion in case there is an emergency. How can God ask us to give so much, especially when the economy is so bad? We never know when we might lose our job or when a drought will wipe out our anticipated yields from crops or livestock.

While we may argue about the need to hold on to what we have in case we run into tough times, we are called to give. Giving is not optional with God. The people of Israel were told through the prophet Malachi that they were robbing God because they failed to give a tenth of what they had as they had been directed to. They were to give of the "first fruits" of their labor: a tenth of the crop yields each year; a tenth of the livestock that had been born. When we fail to give our tenth, we, too, are robbing God.

God has already given us so much. We have the gift of forgiveness for our sins and eternal life. We have God's presence with us and the Holy Spirit to guide us. God meets our needs each and every day, whether it is strength in our times of weakness or comfort when our hearts are heavy.

Because of all God does for us, we are called to give to the needs of others. Our giving supports the mission of the church to make disciples of Jesus Christ. We offer Vacation Bible School for our children. We send our young people to camp and mission trips. We provide Sunday school curriculum to help us grow in our faith. Our giving supports both local and foreign missions.

God calls us to the test. "Put me first in even the smallest things and see if I do not bless you more than when you had everything for yourself." Are you willing to put God to such a test? Are you willing to trust God even in the smallest matters? It might just be that the place to start is with your money. And don't forget your prayers, presence, service, and witness. Test God in one of these things and see if He does not pour out His blessings upon you. Who know? Maybe you will become willing to trust Him in everything if you will just begin to trust God in one thing, no matter how small.

Though he will be away from his home church (St. Peter's Episcopal, Brenham) for a while, we are certain that Stacy's gifts, talent, and experience as an interim choir director will help sustain our music ministry while the Staff-Parish Relations Committee conducts a search to find a permanent choir director. We have placed advertisements and have begun receiving resumes and look forward to following God's direction.

Here is a bit about Stacy so that we might know him better. Please take time to visit with him following worship.

My entire family is very musical so there was no escaping the lure of that very special sound. I began singing in the children's choir at St. James Episcopal Church in Jackson, MS at a very early age. I sang in the church choir until my voice changed and then I spent my teen years playing clarinet and oboe in the school band. When I began college I went back to singing and since that time I have sung not only in church choirs but in large choral ensembles and small chamber groups, both in MS and TX. I came to Houston in 1980 and in 1983 met my wife of 31 years after joining the choir of St. John the Divine. Singing in a church choir has always been a huge part of our marriage and our church life.

During my years of singing I have always been interested in conducting and I have been fortunate to sing under the direction of some very fine conductors. I have been able to hone my conducting skills by assisting my choir directors when they needed an "extra" hand. During my 20 years as a choir member at Emmanuel Episcopal Church in Houston I acted as interim choir director on at least 3 occasions.

About 5 years ago my wife and I bought a small place outside of Somerville and since we were spending almost every weekend there we needed a new church home, which we found at St. Peter's Episcopal in Brenham. Even after we sold our property earlier this year we have continued to sing in the St. Peter's choir. The St. Peter's and First United Methodist choirs have sung together on a couple of occasions. I feel that God has blessed me with musical talents and I am called to help. I understand the impact of the loss of a choir director and am thankful I am able to serve as a bridge until another choir director is called. Working with this wonderful choir will be a great joy.
