



From yesterday's message, here's my list of Advent practices to help me keep a holy, healthy, and happy Advent and Christmas! (you'll notice that I revised #2!)

- 1. Let Go and Let God!
- 2. Expect the Best! Prepare for Other Possibilities. Accept What Really Happens.
- 3. Keep Lists. Work Lists. Don't be enslaved by lists!
- 4. Don't Plan Too Many Things To Do.

(Schedule "un-scheduled" or free time – and keep it!)

5. Keep The Faith! Be Alive!! Thrive!!!

Sunday afternoon arrived and after a short nap, I was up and at 'em with hopes of completing my "to do" list for the day! Lights! Christmas Lights on the House! Decorations & the Tree! Out of the attic and the tree assembled and placed! Everything is out of the attic! The tree is still in the box and the box is still taped shut. The lights on the house are about two-thirds complete and I need to buy three more strands. I could have finished the strands I have on a ladder in the dark, but that wouldn't have been safe and I remember someone saying "Don't be enslaved by the list."! I sometimes get a little disgruntled with myself when I am faced with my words so soon after preaching them! So, though I struggled to leave things uncompleted, I did!

Later that evening, I returned to the store where I purchased the lights to pick up three more strands that I discovered I need. . . . Remember when I said, "Expect the Best!" So do I. Well, I did not find the best. The store is completely out of that style of lights and I want all the lights to match, exactly. It took me a couple of aisles to accept what I found and that's why I revised number 2 as follows: "Expect the Best. Prepare for Other Possibilities. Accept What Really Happens."

The new number 2 reminds me of the Serenity Prayer my mom taught me:

"God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Amen."

I continue to pray for our congregation that we may continue to grow in grace as we seek to make disciples of Jesus Christ. May our Advent and Christmas be holy, healthy, and happy.


