

Monday, March 21 7am -7pm





Stouffer's Food For Thought...

I think my favorite hymn of all time is "Come, O Thou Traveler Unknown," number 386 in <u>The United Methodist Hymnal</u> written by Charles Wesley. Just above hymn number 388 are these words:

John Wesley ended his obituary tribute to his brother Charles at the Methodist Conference in 1788: "His least praise was, his talent for poetry: although Dr. [Isaac] Watts did not scruple to say that 'that single poem, Wrestling Jacob, was worth all the verses he himself had written." A little over two weeks after his brother's death, John Wesley tried to teach the hymn at Bolton, but broke down when he came to the lines "my company before is gone, and I am left alone with thee." The poem was first published in the brothers' Hymns and Sacred Poems of 1742, expounding on Genesis 32:24-32, influenced by Matthew Henry's exposition.

The full text of the poem is number 387 and contains 14 stanzas, half of which end with this line, "thy nature, and thy name is Love." I remember when I approached ordination there was a time prior to the event that I felt like Jacob, wrestling through the night with God, desperately clinging while awaiting daybreak. Holly told me it must have been three weeks of wrestling. And I remember as I stood up from the act of ordination I had an ache in my right hip. I couldn't explain it physically until I remembered the story of God striking Jacob's hip just before dawn. And in a moment, that wrestling match was complete and I emerged into the daylight of ministry as an elder in the United Methodist Church.

As we look forward to this year's Annual Conference, please pray for all our candidates as they prepare for their ordination interviews April 4-5. Please pray also for the Board of Ordained Ministry in this work of mutual discernment as we seek to discern God's call upon the lives of those who feel called to ordained ministry. Two of our very own will be working through this process this year: Adam and Erin Muckleroy.

All these years later, (21 since ordination as an elder), I still wrestle a bit just prior to the Service of Commissioning and Ordination as I remember God's call upon my life. And I am thankful for God's faithfulness through the long night of wrestling, then and since, and through the bright days of ministry. And I look forward to the adventure God has in store for our congregation.

Even Deeper

Fridtjof Nansen, the Norwegian explorer, went north to fathom the depths of the Arctic Ocean. After he found the place he was going to lower the lines, he lowered his first line. It didn't reach the bottom. In his log book he wrote, "...deeper than that."

The next morning he dropped his second line. It didn't touch the bottom either. In his log book he wrote, "...deeper than that." He continued with all of his lines and he couldn't find a line that would touch the bottom of this vast ocean. After each attempt he would write in his log book "...deeper than that."

This pioneer oceanographer was frustrated as to what he should do next. Finally, he decided that he would tie all of the lines together and attempt to plumb the depths of this ocean. When he had tied them and let them all drop, they still didn't reach the bottom. He wrote in his log book "...EVEN DEEPER THAN THAT!"

Imagine that the love of God that was shown to us on the cross is an ocean. Then take the worst thing you ever did, your deepest darkest secret, and put it in that sea of God's grace. Then take all your sins and put them in there also. Then take all of the sins of everyone in the world. Then realize that every one of those sins is covered by God's mercy. Then you would begin to see that God's love is "EVEN DEEPER THAN THAT!"

We have a God who is rich in mercy beyond our comprehension. His grace reaches farther than we can possibly imagine. The depth of His love is without limit. What else can we do but praise His holy Name.

- 1. Many people in the choir can **not** read music...and we work together to learn our parts. It's always a joy!
- 2. Choir rehearsal is open. Arrive when you are available; leave when you must. Rehearsal will be planned to accommodate choir member scheduling needs.
- 3. Choir music is prepared in rehearsal for several weeks before it is shared in worship. (If your schedule would require you to miss some rehearsals, that's okay!)

4. Choir rehearsal is a mid-week spiritual and energy boost!

Dear FUMC Brenham,


There are no words to express our gratitude and heartfelt appreciation for your congregations' prayers and cards during Ryan's journey.
